



Municipal Interest in the HOMEConnecticut Program

The Housing Program for Economic Growth - known as the HOMEConnecticut program - gives towns an opportunity to produce affordable housing that is voluntary, incentive-based, low-cost to the state, and preserves local control. Municipalities can choose to take part in this program, which provides them with incentive payments if they create mixed-income housing in responsible growth zones in town centers, near transit facilities, in areas where infrastructure can support higher densities or in such other locations as the municipality deems appropriate. The program also provides planning and technical assistance grants to aid in the development of the IHZ and/or the housing within each zone. Thus far, the following towns have moved ahead with plans or have expressed interest in participating in the HOMEConnecticut program:
