Disability Laws

ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act)

Description

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in several areas.

Child Find

Description

Each public school district is responsible for identifying, locating, and evaluating all children who may be eligible for special education. This is known as "Child Find." Parents, teachers, or other school personnel may refer a child for evaluation to determine whether a child may be eligible for special education.

IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act)

Description

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) is a law that makes available a free appropriate public education (FAPE) to eligible children with disabilities throughout the nation and ensures special education and related services to those children.

Section 504

Description

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 is a national law that protects qualified individuals from discrimination based on their disability. Section 504 forbids organizations and employers from excluding or denying individuals with disabilities an equal opportunity to receive program benefits and services. It defines the rights of individuals with disabilities to participate in, and have access to, program benefits and services.
