any fee increases should be modest, they were necessary to address the increased operating costs of both areas. Staff had also looked at rental rates and daily admission rates of comparable facilities.

#### **MEMORANDUM**

RE: Public Gathering Permit

Please accept this event summary as support for our Public Gathering Permit application to hold an event on Sunday November 13, 2016 beginning at 2 PM, and expected to run 60 – 75 minutes. The event is sponsored jointly by the Simsbury American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars posts. The program will include a Veterans Day remembrance combined with Dedication of the new Simsbury Veterans Memorial. The Memorial is presently being constructed on the southwest corner of the intersection of Eaglewood Lane and Hopmeadow Street. Completion of the Memorial is expected by the 4<sup>th</sup> week of October.

We will be inviting the public through assorted media outlets as well as mailing invitations with an RSVP card enclosed to approximately 500 people who helped by donating to the Memorial. We are planning for 400 attendees, but recognize the actual figure could be more or less than 400.

We will be making arrangements to offer shuttle transportation from the commuter parking areas between the Drake Hill Shops and Iron Horse Blvd to supplement use of public parking around the Library and in front of Boy Scout Hall. We also will be requesting use of the parking area behind the Congregational Church. Arrangements are being made for a shuttle between the Iron Horse commuter parking lots behind Fitzgerald's.

Our plan is to have speakers lead the ceremonies from a podium on the plaza of the Memorial facing the corner of Eaglewood Ln and Hopmeadow St.

We will be contracting for temporary seating to be placed on the asphalt of Eaglewood Ln and Hopmeadow St. To that end, SPD Chief Ingvertsen has applied to the CT DOT for the necessary permit to close Hopmeadow Street for 4 hours on Nov 13. In addition, closing Hopmeadow and Eaglewood will minimize the distraction of traffic noise during the event. We understand authorization is also needed from the Board of Slectmen to close Eaglewood Ln. Library Director Lisa Karim has been involved with our planning and supports closure of Eaglewood as essential with the understanding access would not be closed to the Library's south parking lot.

Following the ceremony, light refreshments will be provided by a caterer inside the Library. We expect that at least half of the attendees will leave immediately after the event, so the Library has sufficient space for the number of people we expect. The Library has a food permit from the Farmington Valley Health District, and we intend to hire a caterer with a current FVHD permit. There is no need for further permitting, inspection, or approval by FVHD.


Also attached is copy of the Insurance Certificate documenting the required insurance coverage with the Town of Simsbury as an additional insured for the event.

As recommended by the PGP committee, two portable toilets will be temporarily placed near the path from Eaglewood Ln to the parking lot at Boy Scout Hall to supplement facilities within the Library. One of the portable toilets will be designed for use by handicapped individuals.

Attached is a hand drawn map of the Hopmeadow St & vicinity from Jim Gallagher Way south to Drake Hill Road. The following Notes relate to points on the map.

- Note A Close Eaglewood Ln 1PM to 4PM preserving South parking lot access. Police cruiser and officer stationed between parking lot entrance and temporary seating remaining there for duration of closure.
- Note B Close Hopmeadow St @ Drake Hill Rd from 1PM to 4PM; Officer & cruiser remain at the intersection for duration of closure
- Note C Close driveway to Drake Hill Shops with signage & barricades 1PM to 4PM; SPD Sergeant & cruiser at that point for duration of closure
- Note D Close Hopmeadow St at Jim Gallagher Way 1PM to 4PM; Officer & Cruiser at intersection for duration of closure. Detour north bound through traffic to Drake Hill Rd to Iron Horse to intersection with Owens Brook and Hopmeadow St
- Note E1 Temp seating on Eaglewood Ln for 250 guests. Road width is 22'. Begin set up at 1PM. Complete removal by 4PM.
- Note E2 Temp seating area if needed on Library lawn. Begin set up at 1PM. Complete removal by 4PM
- Note E3 Temp seating for 150 guests on Hopmeadow St. Road width 42'. Begin set up at 1PM. Complete removal by 4PM.
- Note F

  Police to place signage beginning at Owens Brook Iron Horse & Hopmeadow to inform about road closure ahead and detour south bound thru traffic onto Iron Horse to Drake Hill Rd and back onto Hopmeadow St. SPD to use discretion in placing additional signage on Hopmeadow from Owens Brook to Wilcox St.







On October 7, 2016 approved a contract negotiated with and ratified by AFSCME Local 2945 which represents town employees in Public Works; Culture, Parks & Recreation; and the Water Pollution Control Authority. That contract included changes in the provisions of the pension plan applicable to these employees, including (1) a change in the normal retirement date from age 65 to age 62 or a combination of age and credited years of service equaling 85; and (2) closure of the defined benefit plan to new employees effective on October 18, 2016.

The attached Resolution is intended to authorize amendment of the defined benefit plan to reflect those changes.

### RESOLUTIONS TO BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN OF THE TOWN OF SIMSBURY

WHEREAS, The Town of Simsbury (the "Town") maintains the Town of Simsbury Retirement Income Plan (the "Retirement Plan") for the benefit of its eligible employees; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the Retirement Plan be amended in order to reflect the most recent agreement with the AFSCME bargaining unit, comprised of the Public Works and Parks Employees in the Retirement Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED: That Amendment No. 2 to the Retirement Plan, in the form presented to this meeting, be and hereby is approved and adopted, together with any modifications that are determined by counsel for the Town to be necessary or desirable to effectuate the intention thereof and to comply with the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; and further

RESOLVED: That the First Selectwoman of the Town or any other officer designated by the First Selectwoman be, and each of them hereby is, authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of the Town, to execute Amendment No. 2 to the Retirement Plan and to take any and all other actions which may be necessary or desirable to effectuate the intention of the foregoing resolution.

## AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO THE TOWN OF SIMSBURY RETIREMENT INCOME PLAN

The Town of Simsbury Retirement Income Plan, as amended and restated effective as of July 1, 2015, is hereby amended as follows:

(1) Effective as of October 18, 2016, Article II of the Plan is amended by deleting the definition of "*Normal Retirement Age*" and substituting the following in lieu thereof:

### "Normal Retirement Age" means the following:

- (a) With respect to a Division 000 Police Officer Employee, the earlier of: (i) the date on which the Participant has reached age fifty-three (53); or (ii) the date on which the Participant has completed twenty-five (25) Years of Credited Service;
- (b) With respect to a Division 001 Police Officer Employee, the date on which the Participant has reached age fifty-five (55) and completed ten Years of Credited Service;
- (c) With respect to a Police Dispatcher Employee, the earlier of: (i) the date on which the Participant has reached age sixty-five (65) and completed five Years of Credited Service; or (ii) the date on which the Participant has reached age sixty-two (62) and completed twenty-five (25) Years of Credited Service;
- (d) With respect to a Public Works and Parks Employee, the earlier of: (i) the date on which the Participant has reached age sixty-two (62) and completed five Years of Credited Service; or (ii) the date on which the Participant's age plus credited years of service is equal to or greater than eighty-five (85); and
- (e) With respect to a Nonunion Employee, a Professional Supervisor Employee, a Professional Employee, or a Secretarial/Clerical/Library Employee, the date on which the Participant has reached age sixty-five (65) and completed five Years of Credited Service.

(2) Effective as of October 18, 2016, Article II of the Plan is amended by adding the following new sentence to the end of subsection (e) of the definition of "Years of Credited Service":

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Plan to the contrary, any Public Works and Parks Employee who is first hired on or after October 18, 2016 shall not be eligible to participate in the Plan.

(3) Effective as of October 18, 2016, Article III of the Plan is amended by adding the following new sentence at the end of Section 3.1(a)(iv):

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Plan to the contrary, any Public Works and Parks Employee who is first hired on or after October 18, 2016 shall not be eligible to participate in the Plan.

(4) Effective as of October 18, 2016, Article III of the Plan is further amended by adding the following new sentence at the end of Section 3.3(d):

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Plan to the contrary, any Public Works and Parks Employee who is first hired on or after October 18, 2016 shall not be eligible to participate in the Plan.

- (5) Effective as of October 18, 2016, Article IV of the Plan is amended by deleting Section 4.1(a)(iv) and substituting the following in lieu thereof:
  - (iv) Public Works and Parks Employees

For Public Works and Parks Employees hired or rehired prior to September 4, 2013: For the period prior to September 1, 2013 2.00% of Compensation For the period on and after September 1, 2013 and prior to September 1, 2014 2.50% of Compensation For the period on and after September 1, 2014 and prior to September 1, 2015 3.00% of Compensation For the period on and after September 1, 2015 and prior to June 30, 2016 3.50% of Compensation For the period on and after June 30, 2016 and prior to July 1, 2017 4.00% of Compensation For the period on and after July 1, 2017 and prior to July 1, 2018 4.50% of Compensation For the period on and after July 1, 2018 5.00% of Compensation

For Public Works and Parks Employees hired or rehired on or after September 4, 2013 who do not participate in the Employer's defined contribution plan:

7.00% of Compensation

Participant Contributions are not required after a Public Works and Parks Employee completes thirty (30) Years of Credited Service.

Participant Contributions are not required after a Public Works and Parks Employee reaches his or her Normal Retirement Date.

Simsbury Developers, LLC, is the owner of 20 Hopmeadow Street upon which a 181 unit apartment complex with club house and pool are being constructed. The development was approved pursuant to a PAD Master Development Plan controlling it and the future development of two adjacent parcels, Lots 1A and 1C.

Sewer service for the three lots is proposed via a sewer line to run east from 20 Hopmeadow Street, under the Department of Transportation's ("DOT") bike trail and DOT land to the east, continuing east through property owned by the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection ("DEEP") where it will connect to an existing Town of Simsbury sewer line. Simsbury Developers, LLC, has worked with both DOT and DEEP to secure easements from these agencies in favor of the Town of Simsbury.

On July 11, 2016, the Board of Selectmen forwarded the proposed sewer easement acceptance proposal to the Simsbury Planning Commission ("Commission") for a C.G.S. §8-24 review at the Commission's July 26, 2016 meeting. The Commission's 8-24 review was favorable.

The easement area owned by DOT is encumbered by an easement in favor of AT&T. In addition to the easement from DOT, AT&T requires that the Town and Simsbury Developers, LLC enter into an Encroachment Permit authorizing Simsbury Developers, LLC, to install the sewer line and the Town to subsequently enter onto ATT's easement for future maintenance, etc of the public sewer line.





The TOWN hereby agrees to defend the STATE as though it were not a sovereign with respect to any such suit or claim. Furthermore, the TOWN or its contractors, subcontractors, agents and assigns will carry indemnity and public liability insurance against any said suit or claim in the following minimum amounts. Public liability limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate; property damage limits of not less than \$250,000; and workers compensation. The State of Connecticut and the Department of Transportation shall be named as additional insured.

The TOWN shall restore the Easement Area within 40 days of completion of the clearing, construction and grading referenced above, to the extent that the clearing, construction and grading require the TOWN to disturb said Easement Area, to the extent that said restoration is not in conflict with the purposes for which the easement is granted. In the event that weather conditions make such restoration impracticable, the TOWN may defer said restoration for not more than four months, with approval of the Department of Transportation.

The STATE herein reserves the right to itself, its successors and assigns, to continue to use the land within which the aforesaid easement has been granted for any use and purposes which shall not in any way interfere with the use thereof by the TOWN, its successors and assigns, in fulfilling the purposes for which this easement is granted.

As further consideration for, and by the acceptance of this easement, the Grantee herein, for itself, its successors and assigns, hereby agrees to now and forever indemnify and save, protect and keep harmless the State of Connecticut from every and all causes of action, suits (including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees and court costs), costs, loss, damage, liability, expense, penalty and fine whatsoever, which may arise from or relating to, or be claimed against the State of Connecticut, by any person or persons, for any and all injuries to person or property or damage of whatever kind or character consequent upon or arising from the negligent use and maintenance by the Grantee, its employees or authorized agents of (i) the Easement Area and (ii) all facilities contained in the Easement Area. Provided nothing herein shall constitute a waiver of sovereign immunity.

The above-described easement is conveyed subject to such rights and easements as may appear of record and to any state of facts which an inspection of the premises may show, including, but not limited to an easement for telecommunication lines in favor of AT&T, as more particularly shown on said map.

Robert J. Klee, COMMISSIONER OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION,

called the "TOWN," does hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the TOWN, its

successors and assigns forever, a permanent easement in whatever right, title and interest the STATE

may have in, under, upon, over and across the following described land for purposes of constructing,

reconstructing, installing, operating, using, maintaining, repairing, altering, expanding, inspecting

and replacing a sanitary sewer line and appurtenances, together with the right to pass and repass with

personnel and equipment on a certain piece or parcel of land as shown on the hereinafter referenced

map, situated in the Town of Simsbury, County of Hartford and State of Connecticut, as set forth in

Schedule A attached hereto.

The TOWN's exercise of its rights set forth herein shall be subject to the TOWN first obtaining all

applicable permits required by law, including those the issuance of which are within the jurisdiction

of the STATE. Nothing herein shall obligate the STATE to issue any such permit. The TOWN shall

at all times abide by all applicable permit requirements. The work conducted by the TOWN shall

conform to all plans and documents submitted to and approved by federal, state and local authorities.

Before commencement of any activities, the TOWN shall coordinate the timing of all activities with

the State's Department of Energy and Environmental Protection's Wildlife Division. The TOWN

shall conform to the "Connecticut Guidelines for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control" by the Council

on Soil and Water Conservation, as amended, during the construction, installation or maintenance of

the easement areas.

No part of the sewer line or appurtenances are to be installed above ground. Manhole covers to

access chambers will be installed to match existing grades and flush with the ground. In addition,

the TOWN will utilize directional drilling techniques to install the sanitary sewer line under the

access road shown on the hereinafter referenced map so as not to interrupt access to Nod Brook

Wildlife Management Area.

The STATE shall incur no expense as result of said easement and the TOWN, its successors and

assigns, shall bear all direct and indirect costs of construction, building, repairing, operation and

maintenance of said easements.

The TOWN, its successors and assigns, shall indemnify and hold the STATE harmless from any suit

or claim which may arise in connection with any activity and usage connected with the easement

In the event that weather conditions make such restoration impracticable, the TOWN may defer said restoration for not more than four months, with approval of the above referenced Wildlife Division.

- (g) to neither cause nor permit use of the rights herein granted by any other person except Permittee's lawful successors, and if Permittee is a utility company, any transferee of the utility system (or operating component of a utility system) of which the Permittee's facilities at the Encroachment Location(s) are a part;

- (h) that AT&T retains all of its rights with respect to its property, right-of-way or easement. Specifically, AT&T retains the right to access its telecommunications cable to repair, maintain or augment its telecommunications network. Any damage to Permittee's facilities as a result of AT&T's exercise of its rights with respect to its property, right-ofway or easement shall be the sole responsibility of Permittee;

#### 5. <u>Incompatible Facilities</u>

This Permit is issued by AT&T and accepted by Permittee with the mutual belief that the facilities of each can exist at the Encroachment Location(s) in the form contemplated when this Permit was issued without disruption to the other. Chairman Rice noted they plan to quickly file a new application in the future. Mr. Rabbitt advised that once the withdrawal letter was received the Public Hearing was no longer active. Mr. Rabbitt indicated revised plans were received a week ago and the Applicant decided to withdraw their Application on 07/25/2016 at 12:24 p.m.; he cautioned the Commissioners not to discuss the former Application any further and noted Staff is available to answer any process questions. From an administrative standpoint, Mr. Rabbitt clarified that as long as a Hearing is open testimony can be submitted up until the moment the Hearing is closed; once the Hearing closes no new information can come in, with the exception of Staff evaluating information submitted as of the Hearing close; it was noted a new application will stand on the record for that new application's process.

a. CGS 8-24 Referral of Proposed Acceptance of Sewer Easements for 20 Hopmeadow Street property

 Chairman Rice noted that 8-24 deals with any property the Town has purview over or ownership of, and the proposed easement is by the State in favor of the Town for new sewer lines. Mr. Rabbitt indicated Attorney Hope representing Garden Homes was present and clarified the easement is associated with the State and also a small sliver crosses other private lands; the primary concern is that it follows a similar track for access to the Simsbury sewer interceptor as proposed during the development process. Mr. Rabbitt provided Staff's review in the Commission meeting packet, along with a proposed motion based on review of the proposal submitted by the Applicant associated with the proposed easement, which would be roughly parallel to Rte. 10; and Staff concluded was consistent with the POCD.

Mr. Hope added that Staff's statements were correct and provided the Commissioners with a copy of the subdivision map showing the different phases and the piece on Hopmeadow Street; the easement generally runs east to west from their property over private lands, and does not

intersect Hopmeadow Street. He stated the DOT would give them an easement to go under the Rail Trail, then through a small piece owned by DEEP, and then to Simsbury's existing sewer line where they would tie in. He reviewed a major benefit was to keep the hookup entirely within Simsbury, which was supported by the WPCA; and one reason was that there was some question of whether the State would be cooperative in providing the easements for hook up. He explained they explored hooking up via Hopmeadow Street and the Town of Avon, but there is a governing agreement between Avon and Simsbury and an associated fee structure. He noted added benefits that: 1) all the hookup fees remain with Simsbury; and 2) the entire future system would be within the Town for all the parcels, including the two in front piece. He showed the Commissioners a map of the two separate sewer line pieces and described the general layout.

Commissioner Beum asked if other utilities are located in this area? Mr. Rabbitt explained they are not using an open trench across the rail trail, but are digging a pushing pit and a receiving pit on the east and west sides using a "jacking" method where they hydraulically push a piece of pipe through the ground to the other side, and once the connection is made the pits are back filled and not visible to Rail Trail users, and the manhole already exists and there are no exposed pipes. Mr. Rabbitt noted their checks and balances throughout the process assure utilities recorded on the map are not affected - typically utilities leave a record. Commissioner Burt asked who would be in charge of easement/sewer maintenance? Mr. Hope responded it is a Town easement with DOT and DEEP maintaining their surface portions; the utilities are subterranean with no functional maintenance piece; and the small section containing the existing Town pipe is maintained by Simsbury. Chairman Rice clarified the existing properties will continue to be owned by DOT and DEEP, but Simsbury would be allowed to access the Town-owned sewer pipe, if required. Mr. Hope confirmed his understanding this method would not interfere with existing data communication lines, as they know where the lines are located.

Commissioner Needham noted a preference for underground sewage in the POCD.

Commissioner Needham made a motion to accept the sewer easements for 20 Hopmeadow Street proposed this evening as being consistent with the goals and recommendations of the Town of Simsbury 2007 Plan of Conservation and Development.

Commissioner Beum seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.

#### VII. GENERAL COMMISSION BUSINESS

#### 1. Plan of Conservation and Development Update – Request for Qualifications

Chairman Rice reviewed that a POCD Update Subcommittee was established comprised of Commissioner Needham; Dave Ryan, Zoning Commission Chairman; Chairman Rice; and Planning Staff members, Jamie Rabbitt and Mike Glidden. The Subcommittee reviewed/evaluated 3 RFQs to update the POCD and was clearly able to decide on 2 quotes and a plan to establish a time/date for them to come in and speak with either the Subcommittee or full Commission – the Commissioners discussed these two options. Mr. Rabbitt noted there is a relatively tight 10-12-month timeframe for revising the POCD and preferred making a decision in August and not delaying until September. He suggested each respondent have 20-30 minutes for a presentation with 10-15 minutes for questions in order to develop a consensus with Staff. He commented that ultimately this Commission has to adopt the POCD and must be

comfortable with the contractor performing the work. He reviewed that the RFQ issued in June required
responses by 06/24/2016 and was advertised through the Connecticut American Association of Planning
and a couple more sites. The Commissioners discussed options for participating in the selection process.
Mr. Rabbitt planned to send out digital copies of the information received to all Commission members for
their review and noted the need to vet questions for the RFQ respondents in order to determine the best fit
for who will deliver a thorough product in a timely manner. The Commissioners and Mr. Rabbitt agreed
on a preferred meeting date of August 23rd with the 30 <sup>th</sup> as a backup date from potentially 6-7 and 7-8
p.m. and believed the 2 respondents would be available with the goal of having the work begin in
September. Mr. Rabbitt confirmed as long as a selection is made by August 30th, a contract could be
quickly in place; he will begin working tomorrow on questions to be vetted.

#### VI. ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Locandro made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:50 p.m.

The above noted request has been forwarded to the Planning Commission from the Board of Selectman pursuant to Connecticut General Statute 8-24. The developer of 20 Hopmeadow Street has proposed that a an easement which is associated with the installation of public sewers be deeded to the town of Simsbury. The Simsbury Water Pollution Control Authority recommends this option versus connecting. The proposal requires securing easements from CTDOT and CTDEEP in addition to the Town of Simsbury.

Connecticut General Statute 8-24 requires the legislative body of a municipality seeks an advisory opinion from the Planning Commission that certain activities are considered consistent with the Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD). Referrals pursuant to CSG 8-24 are required by law for the following activities:

- locate, accept, abandon, widen, narrow or extend any street, bridge, parkway or other public way
- locate, relocate, substantially improve, acquire land for, abandon, sell or lease any airport, park, playground, school or other municipally owned property or public building
- locate or extend any public housing, development, redevelopment or urban renewal project
- locate or extend public utilities and terminals for water, sewerage, light, power, transit and other purposes

The Commission should decide whether the extensions of public utilities which will be within easements held by the Town of Simsbury are considered consistent with the goals and recommendations which are outlined in the POCD. Plans and construction documents have been provided with the request for the Commission's review.

For discussion purposes, staff has prepared a draft motion of approval for the referral.

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Selectmen was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Main Meeting Room of the Simsbury Town Offices. Present were: First Selectman Lisa Heavner; Board members Michael Paine, Cheryl Cook, Christopher Kelly, Elaine Lang and Sean Askham. Others in attendance included: Tom Roy, Director of Public Works; Ed LaMontagne, Chairman of Housing Authority; Colleen O'Connor, Tax Collector; Senator Kevin Witkos; State Representative John Hampton; Gerry Toner, Director of Parks and Recreation, members of the Fire Department, and other interested parties.

#### **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **PUBLIC AUDIENCE**

Joan Coe, 26 Whitcomb Drive, spoke about the elections, the Town Manager form of government, sewer systems, successful events in Simsbury, increase in Police calls, and other issues.

Robert Kalechman, 971 Hopmeadow Street, spoke about running for State Representative, corruption in the State, the Veteran's Monument, and other issues.

Ms. Cook made a motion to amend the agenda to add item d) to accept a donation for the Simsbury Farms Golf Course toward the purchase of a memorial clock. Ms. Lang seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Mr. Kelly made a motion to amend the agenda under Appointments and Resignations to appoint two members of the Board of Finance to the Simsbury Farms Special Revenue Fund Sub-committee. Ms. Cook seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Ms. Cook made a motion to amend the agenda under Appointments and Resignations to appoint Richard Jones to the Board of Ethics. Ms. Lang seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Mr. Askham made a motion to amend the agenda to add item e) waive fees at Eno Memorial Hall on October 2, 2016 for the community Rosh Hashanah event. Mr. Paine seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

#### Proclamation – Mr. & Mrs. Tartaglia

Dan Koppenger, V.P. of the Simsbury Fire District presented an award to Mr. & Mrs. Tartaglia, an awesome couple who did something to save the lives of a family whose house was on fire. They are just great neighbors to have. He hopes everyone follows the "See Something / Say Something" national program.

Mr. Askham also had the honor of reading a proclamation on behalf of the Town.

#### • Tax Collection - Colleen O'Connor, Tax Collector

Ms. O'Connor gave the Board some information on tax collections. She said the online payments have really increased just in one day. Through August she has collected \$8,751,487. They have also introduced "pay by text" and she can't wait to see how this works next year.

Ms. O'Connor did remind everyone that the P.O. Box that receives the checks by mail is the Simsbury Bank Processing Center.

#### • Simsbury Housing Authority – Ed LaMontagne

Pastor Woody gave a slide show about who the Housing Authority is and what they do. The Housing Authority is comprised of the Dr. Owen L. Murphy Apartments and the Virginia Connolly Residence for a total of 110 units. They help the elderly and people with disabilities. He said their revenues are derived from subsidies from the Department of Housing, rents, and private and civic organizations.

Pastor Woody said the Housing Authority is overseen by five commissioners, four full time staff and a number of part-time staff.

Pastor Woody said they do face challenges including health insurance coverage, funding for programs and many spending reductions. They did receive a small cities grant for a new roof, driveway and sidewalk work.

Pastor Woody invited everyone to come get a tour and to see all they have to offer. Mr. LaMontagne said applications are on the website at simsburyha.com or by calling (860) 658-1147.

#### Legislative Update – Representative John Hampton & Senator Kevin Witkos

Representative Hampton said the State budgets were very challenging. He voted against the final budget due to the lack of long term structural reforms. He said he hears people saying they don't want to live here anymore due to high taxes and other issues. There will be a special session starting on Wednesday. He has worked on issues like elder abuse, domestic violence issues, Fire Fighter cancer relief fund, the Children's Committee, and other issues.

Senator Witkos said there will be another deficit in 2017. He said there have been a lot of layoffs, but they are working hard to keep Sikorsky in our State. He said this will be an investment in our State.

Senator Witkos said Simsbury will be receiving a superintendent cut of \$115,000. He said there is also some discussion on a mileage tax.

Ms. Heavner thanked both Senator Witkos and Representative Hampton for working so well with her and the Board, updating them on the issues as soon as they possible can. It has been very helpful for the Board when they have to do the Simsbury budget.

#### **FIRST SELECTMAN'S REPORT**

Ms. Heavner said Simsbury Farms was voted the Farmington Valley's Favorite Golf Course by the Farmington Valley Visitors Association.

Ms. Heavner said safety is a top priority in the Town. All of the Highway and Buildings and Grounds staff have recently been re-certified in CPR by the Simsbury Ambulance Association. These lifesaving skills could potentially benefit both Town staff and the public during an emergency.

Ms. Heavner said there is a drought advisory in effect statewide. There are tips on how to conserve water from the State's Department of Energy and Environmental Protection at http://www.ct.gov/deep/ewp/view.asp?a-2720&q=325664&deepNAV GID=1654.

Ms. Heavner said Election Day is November 8<sup>th</sup>. The voter registration deadline for the Presidential Election is November 1<sup>st</sup>. Info can be read on <a href="http://www.simsbury-ct.gov/registrar-of-voters">http://www.simsbury-ct.gov/registrar-of-voters</a>.

Ms. Heavner said over the next 18 months each property in Town will be reassessed in-line with current market values.

#### **MINUTES OF MEETING**

#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by First Selectwoman Lisa Heavner at 7:31 a.m. Selectmen Mike Paine, Cheryl Cook, Chris Kelly and Elaine Lang were also present. Selectman Sean Askham was absent. Director of Public Works Tom Roy and Director of Administrative Services Thomas Cooke were also present.

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance

Those in attendance stood for the pledge of allegiance.

#### 3. Public Audience

There were no speakers at public audience.

4. Consideration and Action on Request for Approval of the Tentative Agreement between the Town of Simsbury and AFSCME Local 2945 of Council 4, AFL-CIO, Simsbury Public Works and Parks Employees, and for Authorization of the First Selectwoman to Execute the Collective Bargaining Agreement as Modified.

Ms. Heavner asked Mr. Cooke to review the proposed changes to the town's collective bargaining agreement with AFSCME. Mr. Cooke and Mr. Roy proceeded to review the submission form which provided the following information:

- a. Term of Contract
- July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2019

#### b. Wages

- Change in steps resulting in a 3.5% increase for FY2017. New hires shall remain on the first step for 6 months and move to the second step thereafter. Step increases shall thereafter be taken in yearly increments.
- 2% general wage increase each year for FY2018 and FY2019

#### c. <u>Health Insurance Plan Design</u>

- HDHP/HSA: The voluntary High Deductible Health Plan (HDHP) with Health Savings Account (HSA) will be incorporated into the agreement. Employee contributions remain at 15% for this option.
- PPO: The PPO plan option will be eliminated effective July 1, 2018.
- HMO and PPO Premiums: Recent hires are paying a 20% premium for the PPO and HMO. For other employees, employee contributions are increasing from 16% to 17% effective July 1, 2017 (PPO and HMO); from 17% to 18% effective July 1, 2018 (HMO only PPO discontinued); from 18% to 19% effective July 1, 2019, and from 19% to 20% effective June 30, 2020.
- Health Care "Buy-Out": Employees who decline to participate in the town's health insurance plans will receive an annual credit of \$2,000. Employees who elect to retire before the age of 62 and decline town health insurance will receive a \$1,000 annual credit and have the option of reentering the health plan at age 62.

#### d. OPEB Contributions

• OPEB contributions will increase from 1.5% to 2% effective July 1, 2017.

#### e. Retirement Plan Options

- Defined Benefit Plan:
  - Plan closed: Upon ratification of the agreement, the defined benefit plan will be closed to new hires.
  - Participant contributions: Employees participating in the defined benefit plan will increase their contributions from 4% to 4.5% effective July 1, 2017 and from 4.5% to 5% effective July 1, 2018. Employees who were hired after July 1, 2016 but before ratification shall continue to pay 7%.
  - Retirement at age 62 or the "rule of 85": Participants may retire without early retirement penalty upon reaching the age of 62 or when the participant's age and credited years of service equal or exceed a total of 85.
- Defined Contribution Plan: Employees hired after the ratification date of the contract shall be required to participate in the defined contribution plan. Employees shall contribute 5% of base salary. The town shall contribute 7% of base salary with a rolling five year vesting period for employer contributions. All employer contributions shall vest upon completion of the fifth year and thereafter.

#### f. On-Call Pay

• If an issue can be addressed remotely using a town-issued device, the employee will be paid for work in one hour increments (instead of the flat rate of 4 hours of pay).

#### g. CDL Examinations

• Employees who operate CDL vehicles for the town will be reimbursed up to \$150 per DOT physical.

The Board of Selectmen asked questions about the immediate and long-term financial impact of the contract and discussed some of the particulars, including the on-call pay process and the Mr. Paine's experience with the CDL licensing process.

Ms. Lang made a motion to approve the tentative agreement between the Town of Simsbury and AFSCME Local 2945 of Council 4, AFL-CIO, Simsbury Public Works and Parks Employees, and to authorize the First Selectwoman to execute the collective bargaining agreement as modified. Mr. Kelly seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

#### 5. Adjourn

Ms. Lang made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ms. Cook seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 7:55 a.m.
