irst Selectman Lisa Heavner, whose term begins January 2, 2015 with the resignation of Mary Glassman, is a threeterm selectman.

She is liaison to the board of education, chair of the town's Public Safety Subcommittee and has met emergency response training requirements for public officials. She chairs the personnel subcommittee. Heavner recently initiated Simsbury's Technology Task force as well as

Community For Care, which provide s information to families with children suffering from substance abuse. She previously served as Deputy First Selectman.

"As we turn to getting on with the town's business, I thank you for your support and confidence in me," said Heavner.

"Having worked side by side with Mary for the last half decade, I am ready to step up and step in to complete Mary's term and to continue

the work she began. I am up to speed on town issues and take this responsibility seriously. Now is the time to turn our focus to doing the town's business and restoring the public trust."

Heavner added that she has always worked in a bipartisan manner to do what is best for the town and will continue to do so.

Keep fire hydrants clear of snow

he Simsbury Fire District wants to remind residents that hydrants must be kept accessible and easily seen by approaching fire personnel year round. Appropriate

clearance allows for the safe operation of the hydrant by fire personnel and room to connect the needed hoses and appliances to the hydrant. Snow must be removed as soon as the

storm is over and kept at least five feet from the hydrant in all directions and must not obscure visibility. Any questions can be directed to the Simsbury Fire District at 860-658-1971.

Update on Dorset Crossing

he Dorset Crossing Planned Area Development (PAD), approved in 2012, includes one medical building that has already been constructed. That walk-in medical facility has an association with St. Francis.

More medical buildings and offices are slated for this area when the demand is present.

The second part of this development is 48 units of Specialty Housing called Ojakian Commons. Forty units of this housing is specifically designed and set aside for residents with MS. Additionally 8 units are set aside for local residents with special needs.

This facility is only the second of its kind on the east coast of the U.S. The other facility is in New Jersey.

"We look forward to this facility providing a valuable service to the residents who often find living in facilities that are not specifically designed for them to be very difficult," said the town's Director of Community Planning and Development Hiram Peck. "Life can already be more than a little difficult for these folks and we hope this state of the art facility will make their lives a bit easier."

The third section of the PAD, which is also currently under construction is called Eastpointe. It is an apartment complex with a clubhouse and other amenities for its residents. There will be a total of 168 units at Eastpointe which will add to the amount of available new housing units in the "north village" of Simsbury. These units are scheduled to begin accepting occupants in early spring of 2015.

A couple of other notes about this area: The Dorset Crossing PAD is home to the first new "roundabout" in Simsbury. This new roadway configuration was the result of a significant amount of cooperation between the developer, the town and the State of Connecticut as well as Northeast Utilities.



The Northeast Utilities substation was also recently reconstructed and upgraded in order to provide a more dependable source of power for the northern portion of Simsbury. NU has put a significant amount of funding and effort into this upgraded facility and is in the process of adding the final steps which will include some sound walls and additional landscaping to benefit the residents of the area.

Many people are also awaiting the onset of construction of the new Big Y store in the same general area. This too will give the residents another option for shopping choices.
