How does a great library become better? You tell us!

any regard the Simsbury Public Library as a great library. For example, the library received a 99.5 percent satisfaction rating in the 2015 resident opinion survey. But how does a great library improve and become better? The Trustees of the Library are initiating a five-year Strategic Plan to do just that.

The trustees have assembled a group of citizens representing as many different interest groups in Simsbury as possible to form the Strategic Planning Committee. The committee will help develop a plan that will be used by the trustees to set direction for the library.

"As a 42-year resident of Tariffville and a committee member, I am very excited to help plan the Simsbury Public Library of the future — a place that will help fulfill all residents' visions for their town," said Joan Nagy. "This is a new

approach to library planning, one that has the potential to provide great results."

The development of the plan will begin with the committee soliciting residents' aspirations for Simsbury. This is done with a simple four question sheet known as the ASK form, which takes only about 10 minutes to complete.

The committee will gather input from a wide spectrum of residents and library patrons. This process will be done over the next two to three months with many sessions conducted outside the library. The committee will then use the results of the ASK form, and the results of the resident survey done in 2015, to determine how the library can help Simsbury fulfill its aspirations.

How can you help? Visit the library and fill out the simple four question form (the ASK). If you're contacted



by a Strategic Planning Committee member, please take 10 minutes to give your input. The library is very interested in what the community has to say.
