CGS 8-24 Referral to the Board of Selectmen on the proposed playscape to be constructed on the property located on the border of the Performing Arts Center property at 22 Iron Horse Boulevard (Assessor's Map H09, Block 226, Lot 003A) and the property adjacent to the southern boundary of the same (shown on the Assessor's Map as Map H10, Block 226, Lot 002). Zones SC-3, SC-4 and R-40.

At the February 28, 2017 meeting of the Simsbury Planning Commission, the Commission discussed the referral pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes 8-24. This referral was specific to the proposed playground equipment donated by the Simsbury Volunteer Fire Company to be installed at 22 Iron Horse Boulevard (Rotary Park)..

Commissioner Beum made a motion finding that the proposed playground equipment from the Simsbury Volunteer Fire Company at 22 Iron Horse Boulevard is consistent with the goals and recommendations of the Town of Simsbury's 2007 Plan of Conservation and Development. Commissioner Needham seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Please consider this correspondence to serve as an official report from the Planning Commission noting a finding of consistency with the POCD pursuant to CSG 8-24. A copy of the minutes for the 02/28/2017meeting of the Planning Commission is attached to this report for your files.

CGS §7-157(b) provides for the publication of a summary of proposed ordinance changes as an alternative to the publication of the entire text of the ordinance upon approval of the legislative body and subject to certain requirements as set forth in the attached text of the statute.

The proposed summary is also attached for review by the Board of Selectmen.

In addition to making the full text of the amended ordinance available at the Town Clerk's office and by mail, the amended ordinance will also be posted on the Town's website.

Summary of Revised Ordinance Pursuant to CGS §7-157(b)

Simsbury Code of Ordinances, Chapter 133, Solid Waste

The Town of Simsbury's Board of Selectmen has amended the Simsbury Code of Ordinances, Chapter 133, Solid Waste to require delivery of acceptable solid waste to the Materials Innovation and Recycling Authority (MIRA) instead of to the Mid Connecticut Project, and to reflect the existence of an agreement for this purpose between the Town of Simsbury and MIRA; to eliminate a requirement that waste collectors register their vehicles with the Town of Simsbury and pay a registration fee; to eliminate provisions requiring the Town of Simsbury to gather insurance information for collectors; to eliminate definitions of recyclable items; and to eliminate monthly reporting requirements for collectors.

A copy of the revised Ordinance is available for public inspection at the Town Clerk's Office and the Town Clerk shall, upon request, mail a copy of the Ordinance to any person requesting a copy at no charge. The Ordinance is also available for review on the Town of Simsbury website at ______.

§7-157(b) Whenever any town, city, borough or fire district is required to publish any proposed ordinance or ordinance in accordance with subsection (a) of this section, the legislative body of such town, city, borough or fire district may provide that a summary of such proposed ordinance or ordinance shall be published in lieu of such proposed ordinance or ordinance, provided that, in any case in which such a summary is published, the clerk of such town, city, borough or fire district shall make a copy of such proposed ordinance or ordinance available for public inspection and shall, upon request, mail a copy of such or proposed ordinance or ordinance to any person requesting a copy at no charge to such person. Any summary so published shall bear a disclaimer as follows: "This document is prepared for the benefit of the public, solely for purposes of information, summarization and explanation. This document does not represent the intent of the legislative body of (here insert the name of the town, city, borough or fire district) for any purpose." The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any proposed ordinance or ordinance which makes or requires an appropriation.
