- Straightforward and user friendly
- Guide to the Review Process section (Page 3)
- Clear, parcel-based mapping of districts
- Included design guidelines for landscaping, driveways, lighting, etc.
- Discussion of new construction and guidelines
- Discussion of window replacement which is often an issue in historic homes when owners wish to update and install using newer, more efficient windows

What we might do differently:

- More streamlined, maybe incorporate the use of matrixes and simplified tables in the front, with accompanying text afterwards
- Strive to make the document as user friendly as possible
