i. General

 The Town and the Fire District completed a method of understanding (MOU) for the shared services regarding the new public safety radio system. Anticipating completion within the next few months.

ii. Consolidated Monthly Report - December 2020

- 31 vehicles were stolen in 2020, which was a 55% increase (11 vehicles) compared to 2019.
- 35% decrease in MV accidents in 2020 compared to 2019, 383 and 587, respectively.
- Pistol permit applications increased in 2020 to 347 compared to 65 in 2019.

AGENDA ITEMS

CHIEF'S REPORT- GENERAL

• Public Safety Radio System – Marcus Communication is preparing much of the equipment ahead of any major work at the tower sites. They have installed some new radios for the BOE, the ambulance service and they are currently working on police mobile radios.

Personnel

Sean Crowley has performed well during his field training. He has demonstrated strong investigative abilities, interpersonal skills and writing competence.

Eric Popielarczyk began the field training and evaluation program and he is expected to complete the program in May.

We currently have 3 sworn vacancies and 1 dispatch vacancy. The Department continues to go through the applications and the interviews processes to fill those positions.

We continue to have members affected by COVID-19. Since the February meeting, two members were required to quarantine due to known positive exposures at work. Another member was quarantined for just over two weeks due to positive tests within the household.

One officer (assigned to patrol) has been out with a non-work related injury since the first week of December 2020 and the officer is expected to be out for an additional 2-3 months recovery from surgery.

Another officer (assigned to patrol) has been out with a non-work related injury and is expected to return to work within 3 months after recovery from a surgery.

CHIEF'S REPORT- CONSOLIDATED MONTHLY

• Motor Vehicle Thefts – Two vehicles have been stolen since the beginning of the calendar year, both in January. We have found that many of the vehicles stolen from town are being used in violent crimes. The stolen vehicles have been involved in violent crimes. Of the 20 vehicles stolen in 2019, at least 40% are known to have been involved in violent crimes, mostly with firearms.

CHIEF'S REPORT- PRELIMINARY MONTHLY FOR JANUARY 2021
