I hope everyone is safe after the storm that came through last night and into this morning. There were many road closures and power outages, along with school and other activity closings. Our EMS team, which includes Fire, Police, and Public Works are doing their best to make sure things are back to normal as soon as possible. Be careful while driving around town.

State Bond Commission Award

I'd like to start off and acknowledge that the Town of Simsbury was awarded a grant from the State Bonding Commission towards the Performing Arts Center 'Second Act' project. This project will include an enclosed backstage area, with dressing rooms, meeting rooms, and bathrooms, some of which will be available for public use along the trail, by the playground and the playing fields. State Rep Melissa Osborne worked with the town and the PAC on the application and was joined by State Senator Lisa Seminara in the request to bring the money to Simsbury, so it was a true bipartisan effort. Members of town leadership, the PAC Board and elected officials provided input to the application to show the importance of the project to local arts, culture, and economic development. It is a big deal to receive this funding.

Simsbury Public Library

For anyone that saw the recent inappropriate sign display at the library last week, the library sends their regrets and apologies for the display. It was quickly taken down. It referenced political thoughts on the Middle East conflict and included language that was upsetting and harmful to many. They are well aware of the poor decision that was made and will discuss it at the Library Board of Trustees meeting to make sure there is a policy in place, so this doesn't happen again.

Wreaths Across America

Saturday was the annual Wreaths Across America Ceremony and wreath laying. The event was held at Simsbury Cemetery at the top of Plank Hill Rd. All branches of the military were honored, with both elected officials and clergy speaking, along with members of the Abigail Phelps Chapter of the DAR who organizes this event every year. Thank you for inviting me to represent our elected officials and the Town of Simsbury.

Tri-Board Meeting/Bi-Board Meeting

The initial discussions on the fiscal year 2024/2025 budget will be held during the Board of Finance Meeting tomorrow night, Tues, 12-19 at 6:00 PM at the library. The public is welcome to listen to the discussion, either in person, or on Simsbury Community Media. The Tri-Board is made up of the Board of Education, Board of Finance and Board of Selectmen, along with our Town Manager, Finance Director, Budget Director, and members of the Town Leadership team.

Prior to the tri-board meeting, there will be a meeting with the Simsbury Volunteer Ambulance Association, the Board of Finance and Board of Selectmen to discuss the status and needs of the SVAA. That is also at the library but is at 5:00 PM.

Both meetings will be in the Friends of the Library Program Room.

Rt 189/Mountain Ave Intersection concerns

Thank you to all who have reached out to voice your concerns with the changes that have occurred on the bottom of Elm Street where the new bike path crossing has been implemented.

The town is aware of the concerns and are working with the State of CT (these are state roads) to determine what improvements or changes can be made.

§A162-4. Decorum & Standards of Conduct. The Board supports the right of a resident to criticize their local government. The Board strongly urges that all comments addressed to the Board be made appropriately and responsibly, with civility and discretion. This section is not intended to deprive any person their right to freedom of expression or speech, but only to maintain, a safe, productive, and harassment-free workplace and environment for Town staff and visitors. All meeting participants should address the Board, maintain a civil tone, and should not impugn the motive, character, or integrity of any individual. The Board reserves the right to curtail any speaker addressing the Board in a manner that is not consistent with this Section.
