First Selectwoman's Report – February 15, 2017

Budget Update Letter and Important Dates

The letter below was sent out on February 13th from the First Selectwoman, the Chairman of the Board of Finance and the Superintendent of Schools. Please see a copy here:

Dear Residents, Neighbors and Friends,

Today, thanks to the hard work of many volunteers, elected officials and dedicated town staff, Simsbury is a Money Magazine *Top Ten* 'Best Places to Live in America." Others are noticing what Simsbury residents have known for years – Simsbury is a great place to live, learn, retire and do business. Your tax dollars support all that makes Simsbury the place we call home and we work hard every day to ensure you get quality and value for every tax dollar you contribute.

Each budget season the Boards of Selectmen, Education and Finance evaluate "must spends," "should spends," and "want to spends." Priorities and goals are discussed and weighed against what our residents can afford. In addition to the tough choices we make every year at budget time, this year's budget has two additional challenges:

- A likely reduction in State aid due to the State's continued fiscal crisis, caused in large part by their chronic underfunding of the State's financial obligations and;
- A net loss in revenue of about \$790,000 from the demolition of The Hartford building.

Governor Malloy presented his budget to the State Legislature on February 8th and proposed an unprecedented and untenable *\$4.3 million in additional costs for Simsbury*. We expect the budget that is ultimately passed by the State Legislature will look vastly different from this initial proposal and we will be advocating for real cost fixes from the State *- not cost shifts that increase the property tax burden on Simsbury residents.*

Over the next few months, the State Legislature will be reviewing and making changes to the Governor's budget. Like all municipalities, we won't know the final amount of State aid reductions to Simsbury until sometime this spring. We have reached out to Senator Witkos and Representative Hampton and will be working with them to advocate for Simsbury's best interests. The Boards of Selectmen, Finance and Education will be working together and with the Director of Finance to evaluate strategies and options.

Regarding the loss in revenue from The Hartford, fortunately, the Town has planned for this loss for a number of years and has set aside reserves to help cushion the tax impact. The good news is that within three to five years, we expect that loss to be replaced and exceeded with revenues from newly planned development.

No doubt this will be a rocky budget season with difficult challenges. We will continue to be cautious with our spending and find cost savings wherever we can. As we make hard choices and set priorities for the Town, we encourage all to be involved in the process. Give us your input and let us know what is important to you.

Revaluation of Real Estate in Simsbury

In accordance with State law and in order to make sure residents are taxed on the fair value of their properties, revaluation of all real estate in Simsbury is now underway. Over the next year each property in town will be reassessed in-line with current market values. You may see town employees and contractors from *Municipal Valuation Services* assisting with this process.

The first phase is a pre-review which includes comparisons between what is actually observed at the property and what is shown on the assessor's card. The next phase beginning in March or April will include property questionnaires, updating records for work done under building permits, inspection of recently sold properties and valuation. Revaluation notices culminate the process and are expected to be mailed to taxpayers in December 2017. Under Construction in Simsbury

<u>Garden Homes</u> on the south side of town along Hopmeadow Street is now under construction – building foundations have been completed and framing has started. This development was approved for 181 residential rental units, including townhomes and apartment style housing. Commercial and retail units were also approved as part of the Planned Area Development (PAD), but zoning and specific site plan approvals have yet to be sought and therefore only the residential component is under construction at this time. <u>*Highcroft*</u>: 272 residential rental units off Powder Forest Drive are also under construction by Landworks Development/Nelson Construction team. The project includes *Highcroft Apartment Homes* with 224 apartment units and *Highcroft Townhomes* with 48 units. Move-ins commenced in July 2016 and construction is expected to conclude on the first 128 unit phase in late spring 2017. <u>Berkshire Bank</u>: At the Corner of Bushy Hill and Albany Turnpike, Berkshire Bank is waiting on interior fit-out and is not yet open.

Permitted

<u>Big Y</u> has indicated that they have delayed a start date in Simsbury for at least a year and possibly into 2018 based on internal financial priorities and commitments elsewhere, but will begin removal of the buildings on their property. Big Y further indicated that they are still interested in Simsbury and confirmed that they have all their town and state permits in place for when they do begin.

<u>Hoskins Road Workforce Overlay Zone (WHOZ)</u>: The Town planning boards have approved 88 residential units for the property with twenty percent affordable housing. Although the project has been approved there is currently no activity.

<u>Chestnut Hills</u>: Located on the corner of Drake Hill and Hopmeadow Street, 46 unit apartments have been approved for the historical building and the surrounding property. This property is currently for sale.

On the Horizon

<u>The Silverman Group</u>: On October 17th the Silverman Group from New Jersey submitted an application to the Town's Zoning Commission for a Master Site Development Plan (MSDP)

under the Hartford-Simsbury Form Based Code for the northern portion (40 acres) of the former Hartford property. Their application included plans for a 120 bed assisted living facility, 280 units of luxury rental housing (156 units in stacked flats and 124 units in town homes), a community center and 11,600 square feet of retail/office space in a Traditional Neighborhood Design (TND) setting. The Town's Design Review Board approved the Master Site Development Plan on November 21st.

On December 5th after two public hearings and considerable deliberations, the Zoning Commission approved the Silverman's application for a MSDP with seven conditions. The Hartford-Simsbury Form Based Code was adopted on July 7, 2014, and went into effect on August 1, 2014. It was adopted after a systematic study of the site was undertaken by the Town of Simsbury and The Hartford in 2013 utilizing various consultants (Gateway Planning, Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. Catalyst and CB Richard Ellis). The adoption of the Code solidified a two-step process. The first step was the application for and approval of a Master Site Development Plan (MSPD) which was accomplished on December 5th. The second step requires a subsequent application to the Zoning Commission for site plan approval conforming to the MSPD. Upon approval of the final site plan the applicant can begin the building permit process, pending any additional state approvals. It is anticipated that the applicant will apply for site plan approval in late February or early March 2017.

<u>*Girard Brothers Corporation*</u>: 32 and 36 Iron Horse Blvd. (Simscroft-Echo Farms). Initial concept plans have been presented to Design Review, Planning and Zoning for a multifamily residential community.
