DEPARTMENT NEWS & NOTES

Town Manager's Office: Tax Collector Colleen O'Connor is retiring and her last day is Thursday, March 28th. She has been with the Town for nearly 30 years; starting as the Senior Center Clerk, Tax Clerk and finally as our Tax Collector. We thank her for her exemplary service over the years and wish her a comfortable and well-deserved happy retirement.

The Human Library event was Saturday, March 23rd @ 10 AM organized by the Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Council!

In the best sense of the word, the Human Library was a library of people and their experiences with prejudice. However, instead of paperback books, actual people were on loan for conversations. The concept is about acknowledging and challenging the prejudice that we all carry towards one another. For that reason, the Human Library creates a safe space for conversation where topics subject to taboo, marginalization, or stigmatization can be openly addressed without condemnation. The people acting as Books have directly or indirectly been exposed to prejudice, bias, or discrimination based on aspects of their person, heritage, or life experiences.

Public Works: This week, all of Public Works (Highway, Buildings and Grounds, WPC, Engineering, and Administration) will take a refresher on CPR, AED and Stop the Bleed Training. This custom First Aid training is focused on the skills necessary to assist in medical emergencies during the initial and critical minutes before an ambulance or other support arrives. Many times, in the course of our work, our staff are the first ones on scene for a number of medical emergencies and we are committed as a Department to be ready to respond. This training adds to the safety of our co-workers and community.
