Budget Continuation

The Board of Finance heard from the public last night at Town Hall, as part of the public hearing continuation, which was then closed. They voted on the budget after much discussion, with changes made to the BOS budget. The BOS will meet virtually on Monday, April 24th, to approve the budget mailer and final resolutions, along with setting the referendum date in May.

Simsbury Main Street Partnership Meeting

I attended the 4/13/2023 board meeting last week. We discussed the reasons for the Business Grant funding not being part of the budget and addressed questions on this topic. For those who have sent emails on this, I am working on getting back to everyone and appreciate your patience. We discussed the MOU, and they provided a target date for us to receive a draft of May 15th. From that point, we will work on moving this forward with our Town Attorney, Interim Town Manager, and BOS. The purpose of this MOU is to define the roles and relationship with our partner Exec Director, Sarah Nielson, and our business community regarding economic development activities in Simsbury.

Reminder, that as of May 1st, Chief Nick Boulter will be Acting Town Manager, and Lee Erdmann will come on as Interim Town Manager on June 1st. The BOS is currently waiting for responses to the RFQ (Request for Qualifications) from Exec Search Consultants to manage this process with the town.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

The state has begun to slow down its reporting of virus-related data at the municipal level. As we near the end of the federal pandemic emergency designation, we will cease sharing this information in the Town Manager's Report on May 8th. The state's municipal COVID alert system has not been updated for Simsbury for the period ending on April 9th. Two weeks ago, we had a total of 5 cases. We also had a positivity rate of 4.12%. As a reminder, this data does not include positive test results from at-home test kits.

In Hartford County, community levels of transmission are "low", as determined by the CDC. At this time, there are no counties in Connecticut considered to be "high" according to the CDC Community Levels categorization. The federal government is again offering free COVID test kits. Each household is eligible to order 4 kits. You can order the kits at: https://www.covid.gov/tests.
