Budget Update

On Tuesday April 23rd, the Board of Finance will hold its second public hearing on the budget. It will take place at 5:45pm at the Simsbury Public Library.

The Board of Selectmen's <u>adopted budget</u> that we sent to public hearing maintains town services at their current level, and contains very few service enhancements. Healthcare costs and debt service have proven to be a significant budget driver. We have worked hard to balance those obligations, the high expectations of our residents for services, and a desire to keep increases in the mill rate in check. You can find all of the budget materials <u>here</u>, including the full budget document as well as a PowerPoint summary.

The budget referendum at Henry James Middle School is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday May 14th.

Planning Department

- Mcleans filed a text amendment application with the Zoning Commission for the construction of a new independent senior living facility within the campus. The proposal is for a 4 ½ story structure to be constructed with 78 apartment units which will be independent senior living.
- 200 Hopmeadow Street (former Hartford property): roadway work associated with the project is anticipated to start this week. The roadwork is associated with the CTDOT approval for the project. The plan for the property consists of apartments, an assisted living facility, and some commercial development. Work has begun on one of two commercial buildings for the development. The assisted living portion of the development is scheduled to be open in late July/early August.

Tobacco Valley Solar

On March 28, 2019, the Connecticut Siting Council approved the development and management plan for the 26 megawatt solar farm off Hoskins and County Road. The Town reviewed the development and management plan and determined that the plans comply with the stipulated agreement. Last week a building permit application was filed for the construction. The contractors have mobilized and started some of the site work associated with the project. According to the development and management plan, the project is anticipated to be completed in 8 months. Planning Director Mike Glidden and Town Engineer Jeff Shea will provide the Board of Selectman a presentation on the project in May.

Climax Road Update

The affordable housing development for the construction of 19 homes at 80 Climax Road was under appeal. The superior court judge remanded the application back to the Planning Commission with 3 areas of concern. According to the ruling, the judge ordered that a public hearing be held on these three areas only. The comments were all concerning drainage. A public hearing is scheduled for May 14, 2019 at which time the Planning Commission will discuss the areas that were remanded back to the Commission by the Court.

Thank You Tax Volunteers

Thank you to AARP Tax Aid, the Simsbury Library, Senior Center, and all the volunteers who gave their time to assist members of our community with their taxes. The service was held free of charge at the library during tax season. Nearly 200 tax returns were completed during that time for Simsbury residents.

Wild & Scenic Celebration

Senator Chris Murphy will be holding a celebration in Simsbury to mark the Wild & Scenic designation for the Lower Farmington River, Saturday, May 11 from noon to 1:30pm at the Flower Bridge. Senator Murphy will be joined by the Farmington River Watershed Association and other local stakeholders for a casual get together and a brief program. Attendees are encouraged to bring folding chairs, a picnic blanket, and some lunch. The Wild & Scenic Designation enables the river to be eligible for up to \$100 thousand a year in federal funds for conservation.

E-Cycling Event

The Simsbury Grange and Green Monster E-Cycling are co-hosting a recycling event on May 11th, from 9am to noon at the former Andy's Market, 836 Hopmeadow Street. Almost anything with a cord or battery is accepted, including televisions, computers, printers, and stereo equipment. Air conditioners, washers/dryers, refrigerators, vacuums, and microwaves are <u>not</u> accepted. Members of the Simsbury Grange will be assisted by local students, including Boy Scout Troop 76.

Memorial Day Parades

The Town of Simsbury, American Legion Post 84 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1926 are organizing two Memorial Day parades on May 27th. The Tariffville parade will march along Winthrop Street starting at 9am followed by a ceremony at St. Bernard's Cemetery. The Simsbury parade will start at 1:30. As usual, it will proceed south along Hopmeadow Street from Owens Brook Boulevard to the Library. There will be a ceremony on the Simsbury Veterans Memorial following the parade. The theme this year is the 75th anniversary of D-Day. We will be recognizing our World War II veterans and the Scouts will tell stories of 5 of Simsbury's World War II veterans who died in service.

New Park Construction

In June, the town is scheduled to begin work on a new park next to the Flower Bridge. It will include new landscaping, paver walkways, and a new pavilion. This project will also improve access to the river for the launching of kayaks. While this park will enhance an already amazing attraction, the town will unfortunately need to close the Flower Bridge for much of the 2019 season. It will remain open until June to allow for the annual Duck Race and Burgers on the Bridge Fundraisers.

If you have questions about the new park or the bridge closure, I encourage you to review a presentation, which was recently delivered to the Board of Selectmen. The temporary closure of the bridge is not something we take lightly, but I'm very excited that we'll be able to unveil the new park in time for Simsbury's 350th celebration.

Sustainable CT

At our February 11th meeting, the Board of Selectmen adopted a resolution joining the Sustainable CT program. It's an environmental certification program that towns can join free of charge. The part of the program I'm most excited about is the structure it will provide our town in the creation of a roadmap of

BOARD OF SELECTMEN BUSINESS:

FY 19/20 Budget: The next public hearing on the budget will be held tomorrow, Tuesday, April 23rd at 5:45pm at Program Room 1 of the Simsbury Public Library. The referendum date will likely be held on Tuesday, May 14th. The Board of Selectmen will have a brief special meeting this Friday, April 26, 2019 at 8:30am in the Main Meeting Room of Town Hall to take care of a number of procedural budget items. A call-in number is available for those members unable to attend in person.

Delegation of Open Space Stewardship and Land Management Update: The Conservation Commission has requested additional time to discuss the referral regarding the delegation of Open Space stewardship and land management duties. You referred the matter to the Conservation Commission at your March 25th Board of Selectmen meeting. We plan to report on this item at your May 13th meeting.

DEPARTMENTAL NEWS & NOTES

Town Manager's Office: The Hometown Hero Committee is meeting on May 6th to review received nominations. The annual Hometown Hero Ceremony will be held on Wednesday, May 29th at 4:30pm at the Eno Memorial Hall auditorium.

Police Department: For the 4th year in a row, the Town of Simsbury was recognized as one of the 20 safest cities in Connecticut by SafeWise, a private organization which provides consumers with resources and tools to help them choose appropriate security systems. According to the report, Simsbury ranked 3rd out of Connecticut's 20 safest municipalities. Simsbury moved up from the number 8 spot in last year's ranking. The ranking is based on SafeWise's review of FBI crime report statistics, including the number of violent crimes and property crimes, as well as population data. Violent crimes are defined as aggravated assault, murder, rape and robbery, while property crimes include burglary, arson, larceny theft and motor vehicle theft. SafeWise calculates crime rates on a per 1,000 population ratio to allow comparison with municipalities of different sizes. Simsbury's violent crimes were 0.16 per 1,000 people, which is significantly lower than the statewide average of 2.25 per 1,000. Similarly, the Town's property crimes were just 6.68 per 1,000 people, compared with the statewide average of 19.53 per 1,000. Click here for the 2019 report.

Veterans Resource Fair: A Veterans Resource Fair will be held on April 26th from 8am – 5pm at Tunxis Community College. The event is open to veterans who are community college students and faculty and staff that work with them. The Farmington Valley Health District is a co-sponsor of this event.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection: There will be a household hazardous waste collection on Saturday, April 27, 2019 at the Farmington High School, 10 Monteith Drive, Farmington, CT from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. This regional initiative is open to all residents from Simsbury, Avon, Canton, Farmington, and Granby. Sample types of items accepted include: fluorescent and compact light bulbs; batteries; lawn care chemicals; switches or items containing Mercury; household cleaners; and chemicals from the garage or workshop. In addition to collecting household hazardous waste items, residents can also drop off electronics, used motor oil, and personal documents for shredding (up to 2 boxes) at no cost.
