Town Manager Search UPDATE

On Monday, May 15th, the Executive Search Committee, made up of all members of the BOS, met in Executive Session with Attorney Mike Harrington, and Attorney Bob DeCresenzo to review the 3 applicants that were being considered for the Executive Search Firm for the Town Manager Search. A consensual decision was made and voted on in open session. GovHR USA is the firm that we look forward to working with over the coming months in our Town Manager search. We all agreed that we liked their methodology – from creating a desired Town Manager Profile, to bringing in qualified candidates - which includes multiple stakeholders along the way. Simsbury Main Street Partnership MOU update

Establishing an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with the Simsbury Main Street Partnership is one of the BOS established goals for this term. During the budget workshops, our board created a condition that we have the MOU prior to releasing their funding, which has been requested annually via our Outside Agency Funding Application.

We received a draft last week, and I have forwarded it to our Interim Town Manager, and Town Attorney for an initial review. Once we have a working draft in place, we will discuss this at the board level, which has been the normal practice for an MOU. This will help define the roles and responsibilities for SMSP and working with Executive Director Sarah Nielson around Economic Development.

Below is information that was provided to the town for both parades.

EVENT INFO

Description of Event:
Annual Memorial Day Parade for Tariffville, CT.

Parade Organizers, groups and participants will gather/muster at the Tariffville Green. Gather/muster time is 830am-845am with Step off is scheduled for 9am. As groups/participants arrive, they will be lined up according to the Parade Committees Order of March starting on the corner of Winthrop and Main Street and heading down Main Street towards Tariffville Park. When parade steps off, participants will march/walk up Winthrop Street, pausing at the firehouse for the placement of a ceremonial wreath, then continuing up Winthrop Street, turning right into St. Bernards Cemetery. After groups/participants have all arrived at the Cemetery, the Memorial Day ceremony will commence. At the conclusion of the Ceremony, Participants/Groups will either head home or to Trinity Church for a small reception.

Parking is available at Trinity Church, at the Church across from Tariffville Cemetery (formerly known as St Bernards Church) and at peoples personal homes. Bathrooms are available for use at both of the Churches

In case of inclement weather, Trinity Church will host the Memorial Day Ceremony.

Parade Organizers, groups and participants will gather/muster at Liberty Bank. Gather/muster time is 1245pm with Step off is scheduled for 130pm. As groups/participants arrive, they will be lined up according to the Parade Committees Order of March starting on the corner of Owens Brook and Hopmeadow and heading up the hill to Winterset Road. When parade steps off, participants will ride/march/walk down Owens Brook Blvd wish to the Simsbury Veterans Memorial for the ceremony. Once the groups/participants have all fully arrived at the Simsbury Veterans Memorial, the Memorial Day ceremony will commence. At the conclusion of the Ceremony, Participants/Groups will either head home or to the reception afterwards.

Parking is available at 1st Church, multiple business, at the Jim Gallagher Way parking lot and people's personal homes for their own vehicles. Porta-Potties/Port-O-Lets will be requested to be placed on Owens Brook Blvd and Somerset St. Multiple businesses will also allow use of bathrooms.

DEPARTMENT NEWS & NOTES

Library: The library is looking for a Book Bike Summer Intern! If you know someone who would be interested in this opportunity please have them go to www.simsbury-ct.gov/jobs. The Book Bike Summer Intern would be responsible for riding the Book Bike to various locations in Town including the 5 elementary schools and engage with the community to build knowledge and understanding of the breadth and scope of library offerings, programs and services.

Public Works: The Public Works Department hosted the annual Touch-A-Truck this past Saturday from 9 am to 12:30 pm. There were over 400 participants with raving reviews from kids and adults. There were endless amounts of trucks and equipment from the Highway Department as well as some from the Parks and Recreation, Police and Fire Departments.

The Simsbury Public Works Department will be hosting a regional Household Hazardous Waste Collection at the DPW facility at 66 Town Forest Road, West Simsbury, on Saturday, June 10, 2023, from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM. Participants should access Town Forest Road from Stratton Brook Road to keep the line orderly. This event is run in conjunction with the Towns of Avon, Canton, Farmington, Granby, and Suffield. Residents will be able to dispose of their qualifying items at no cost by providing proof of residency upon arrival. These collections are for items that cannot go into the regular trash, keeping hazardous materials from being deposited into the landfill. Police Department: The Police Department will be hosting the annual Junior Police Academy July 31 through August 4 for children of Simsbury (5th grade to 8th grade). They will experience hands-on methods and techniques in the profession of law enforcement. Throughout this academy, respect, self-discipline, integrity, equality, education, and physical fitness will be stressed. Attendees will also gain an understanding of community responsibility, problem solving, and the role of the public servant. Memorial Day Parades: There will be two parades in town again this year for Memorial Day. The Tariffville parade begins at 9:00 am. It starts on Winthrop Street at Main Street, travels up Winthrop into St. Bernards Cemetery, followed by a ceremony.

The Simsbury parade begins at 1:30 pm. It starts on Route 10 at Owens Brook Boulevard and travels south on Route 10 to Simsbury Veteran's Memorial in front of the library for a ceremony. I hope you can all join us.
