This year's theme — "Where Community Grows" — celebrates the vital role park and recreation professionals play in bringing people together, providing essential services and fostering the growth of our communities.

As park and recreation professionals, you make a positive impact on the lives of your community members every single day. Let's come together this year and show the world just how much parks and recreation means to our communities.

The Simsbury Community Band 50th Anniversary

Please join me in congratulating our community band on their 50th Anniversary. I was invited back in February, by Fred Bull, President, if I would come to the summer opener, last Wednesday at Simsbury Farms, to say a few words. They were presented with a proclamation on their achievement and commitment.

My memories of the band are from Schultz Park, where we would sometimes go – on a Wed night – with our young kids – to listen to the band on a summer night. Music and cultural events in town bring us all together. Coming from a family where my mom was a pianist and music teacher, and as a teen from the 70's whose life was driven my music and concerts, I know the value of music. It's good for the soul, lifts your mood and allows you to make a connection to the sounds.

They continue to play Wednesday nights at the rink thru the summer. Bring a chair and come out to enjoy some music.

Simsbury-Granby Rotary Month

July is Simsbury-Granby Rotary Month, where our Rotarians are kicking off awareness of the work they do, along with starting to plan for changes and improvements to Rotary Park, as they partner with the Town of Simsbury. I wrote and presented them with the following proclamation, which touches on their involvement and commitment to community.

PROCLAMATION in Recognition of The Simsbury-Granby Rotary Month

Whereas, for more than 110 years, Rotarians have used their passion, energy, and intelligence to find ways to better our world, with the Simsbury-Granby Rotary one the many clubs across the globe, made up of dedicated people who share a love for community service and friendship, coming together at meetings, events and to work on projects as a way for members to strengthen connections to friends and neighbors, with a commitment to improving lives; and

Whereas, the investment this group of dedicated volunteers has had in our community is immense — they raised the initial \$10,000 for the Memorial pool construction, donated the first racing shell to the SHS crew team, funded construction of the SHS athletic field press box, built the refreshment stand at Memorial field, helped fund construction of the Performing Arts Center shell, and raised money and donated hard work for the beloved Rotary Park boundless playground that has been entertaining families in our town center since 2002; and

Whereas, the River Run has been an iconic event in Simsbury since 1995, attracting runners from all over to participate in both 5Ks or 10Ks along our scenic river and country roads, with all proceeds going to various groups, including, college scholarships for Simsbury and Granby High School graduates, Food Share in Bloomfield, ABC House in Simsbury, and many other Rotary-assisted non-profits; and

Whereas, the club has been providing funding for the 'Children Friendly' food pantry with the Simsbury Community and Social Services department, purchasing kid friendly foods, where at each Cheese Day they give out kid friendly food packed for each family, with the height of the pandemic showing the greatest need, but continuing to help our local families to this day, helping to secure funding for this program; and

Whereas, this proclamation only scratches the surface on what this group has done, and plans to do in the coming years, for which we thank them all in advance for improving and working alongside The Town of Simsbury; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendy Mackstutis, First Selectman of the Town of Simsbury, do hereby Proclaim and Recognize this as Simsbury-Granby Rotary Month, to highlight their passion for community service and acknowledge all the work they do to improve lives, not just here in Simsbury and Granby, but world-wide.

Library:

• The Simsbury Public Library has been awarded the grant from CT Humanities for the program Simsbury History and Culinary Storytelling. The program will focus on four historic buildings in town, explore their histories, and examine their journeys to the present-day restaurants these buildings have become with a panel of the notable chefs from the restaurants, a historical authority, and a moderator that is curious about both the history and the food.

Specifically, the historic buildings anticipated to be featured include Abigail's (formerly Pettibone Tavern), Simsbury 1820 House, Millwright's (formerly Hop Brook Tavern), and Metro Bis (the Ensign House.) We have a tentative commitment from Connecticut Public's Seasoned podcast crew with Chef Plum to moderate and record the program.
