

Claude Bolling was a remarkable composer/jazz pianist born in Cannes in the early 20th century and passing recently in 2020. Bolling was a major part of the traditional jazz revival in the late 1960s and became good friends with Oscar Peterson in the process. Bolling's Suite for Jazz Flute premiered in 1975 and the Columbia record featuring flute virtuoso Jean-Pierre Rampal took the US by storm. It remained on the Billboard top 40 list for almost ten years!

His vast repertoire includes the great piano classics as well as the complete solo piano music of George Gershwin. His PBS television special, Gershwin by Bisaccia, has been broadcast throughout the U.S. and seen by millions. Bisaccia has given master classes at Colby College in



Energy Assistance KEEP WARM THIS WINTER! Social Services is taking Energy Assistance Program applications for residents who heat with deliverable fuels such as oil or propane, or utilities such as electricity or natural gas. This program helps households pay for primary heating bills. Benefits are also available for people who have heat included in their rent. Income guidelines depend upon number in household. Asset limits apply. Documentation is required. Please call for information or an appointment. **Dial-A-Ride** A Dial-A-Ride pass is available to Simsbury residents only, who are disabled or over the age of 60: \$25 for an individual or \$35 for a couple for a year. The pass allows residents use of the Dial-A-Ride buses in Simsbury, Granby and Avon, as well as Jump On Board Senior Center trips. Two out-of-town medical rides can be requested monthly. Passes can be obtained from Social Services. If there is no school due to inclement weather, Dial-A-Ride does not run.
