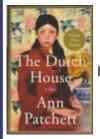

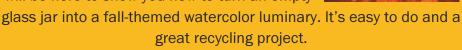

Dial-A-Ride

A Dial-A-Ride pass is available to Simsbury residents only, who are disabled or over the age of 60: \$25 for an individual or \$35 for a couple for a year. The pass allows residents use of the Dial-A-Ride buses around town, in Granby and Avon, as well as Jump On Board Senior Center trips. In addition, two out-of-town medical rides per month can be requested. Passes can be obtained at the Social Services office.
