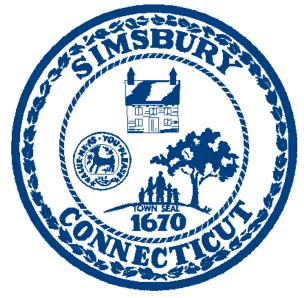

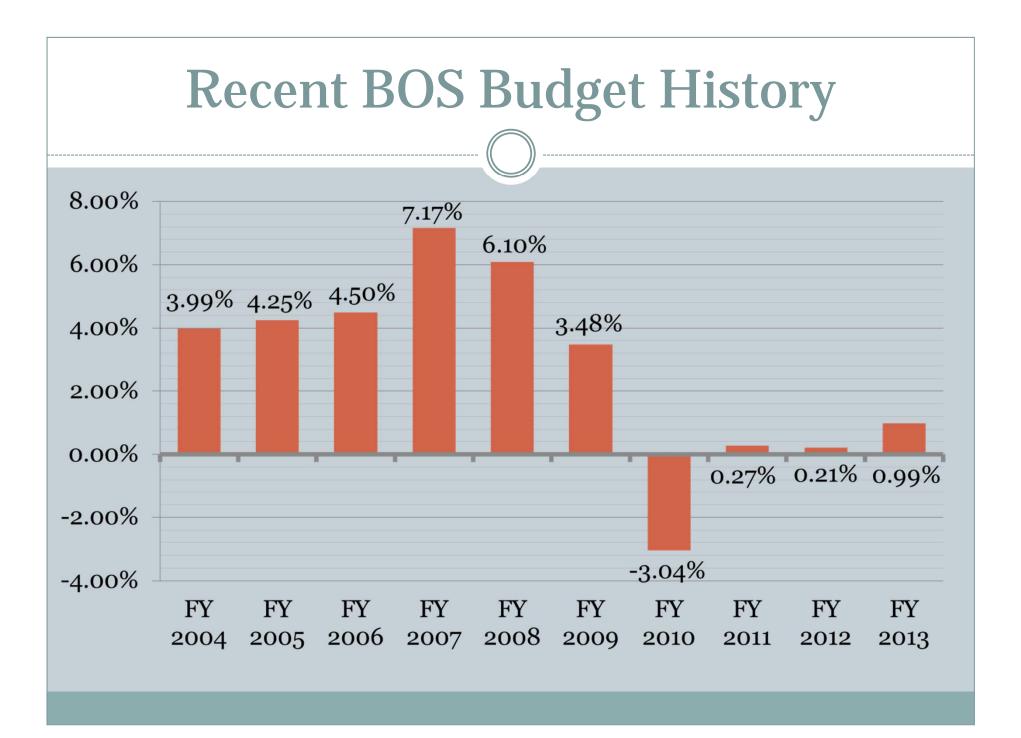

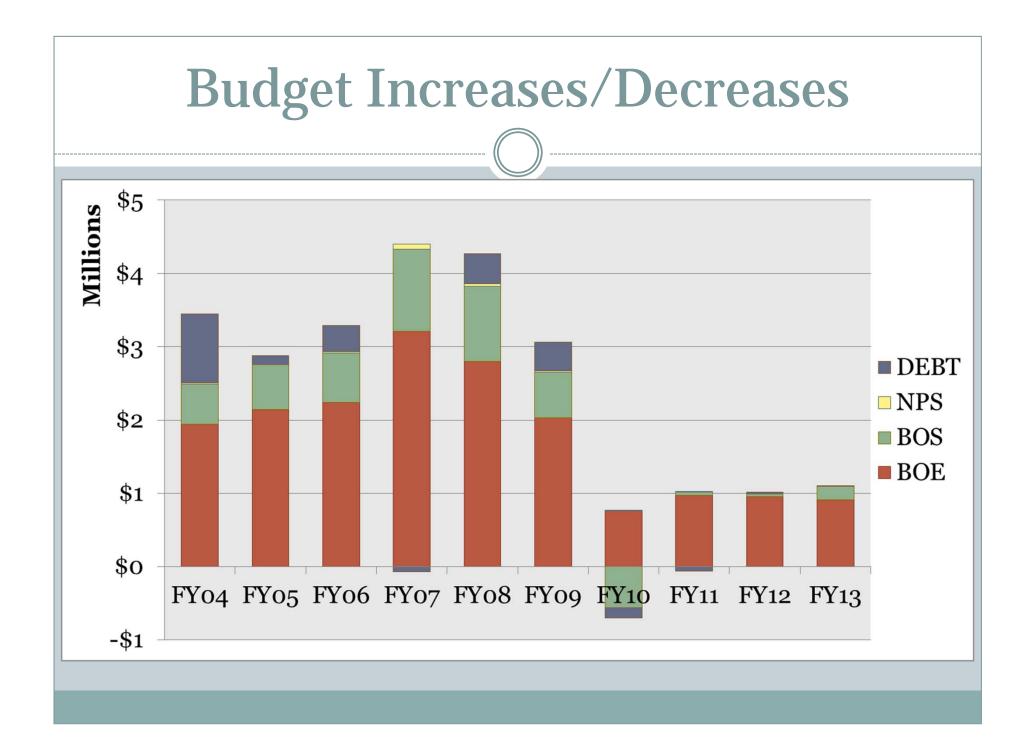


Pressures on Town Budget

Median Net Taxable Assessments

2002-2006 Grand Lists

Median Net Taxable Assessment = $\frac{179,000}{1000}$ Which indicates an average home value of approx. 256,000

2007-2011 Grand Lists

Median Net Taxable Assessment of <u>\$231,000</u> Which indicates an average home value of approx. \$330,000

2012 Grand List (recent revaluation)

Median Net Taxable Assessment of <u>\$193,000</u> Which indicates average home value of approx. \$276,000

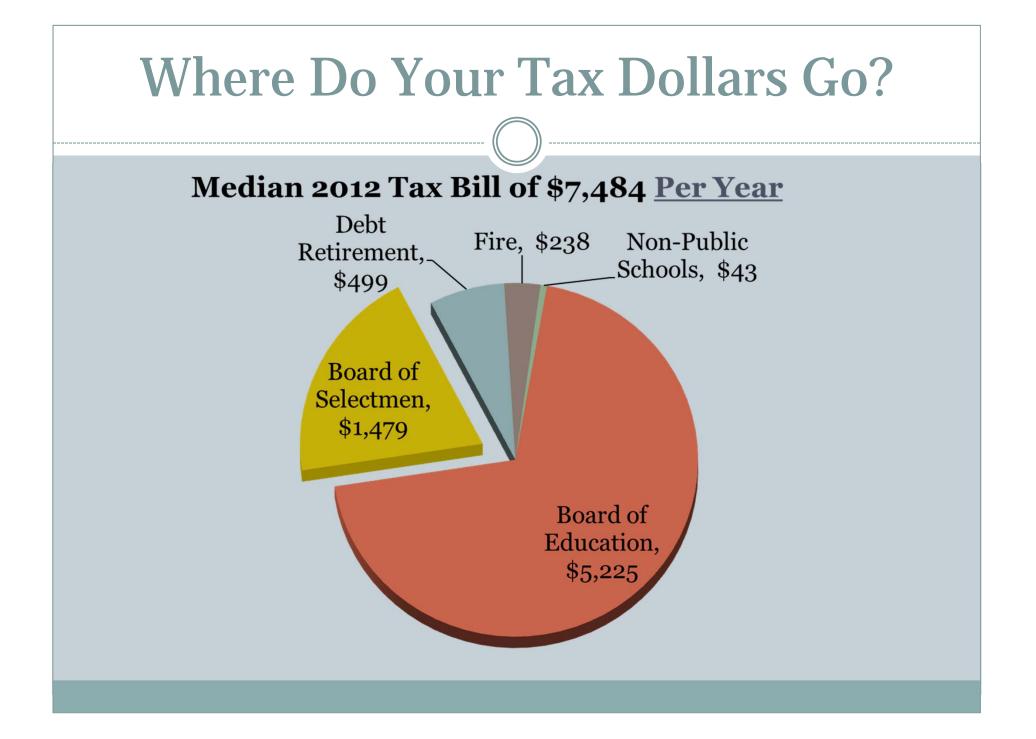
2002-2006 Grand Lists

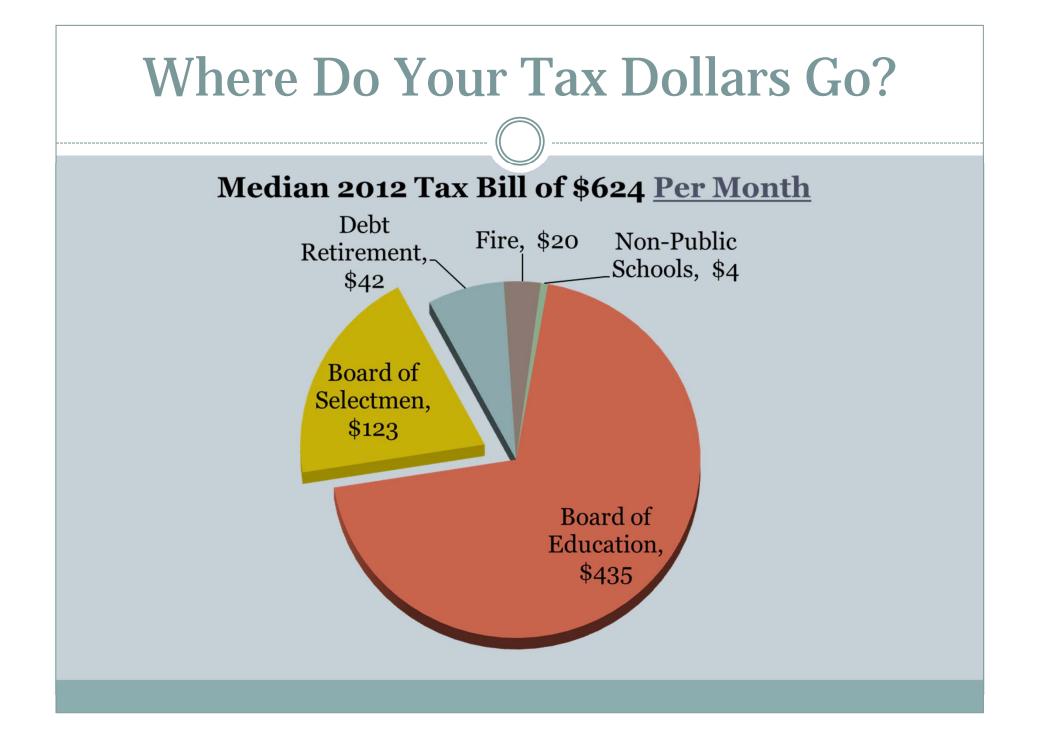
Median Net Taxable Assessment = $\frac{179,000}{1000}$ Which indicates an average home value of approx. 256,000

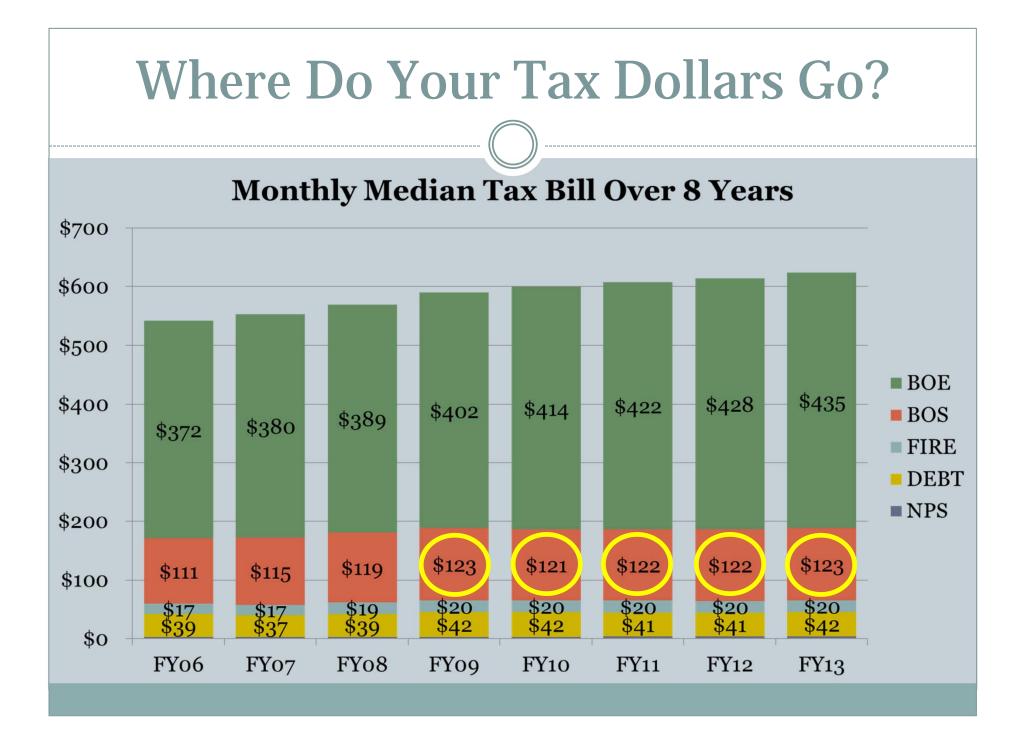
2007-2011 Grand Lists

Median Net Taxable Assessment of <u>\$231,000</u> Which indicates an average home value of approx. \$330,000

Using the current **32.40 Mill Rate** and the **2011 Grand List**, the Median Tax Bill in Simsbury is approximately **\$7,484**

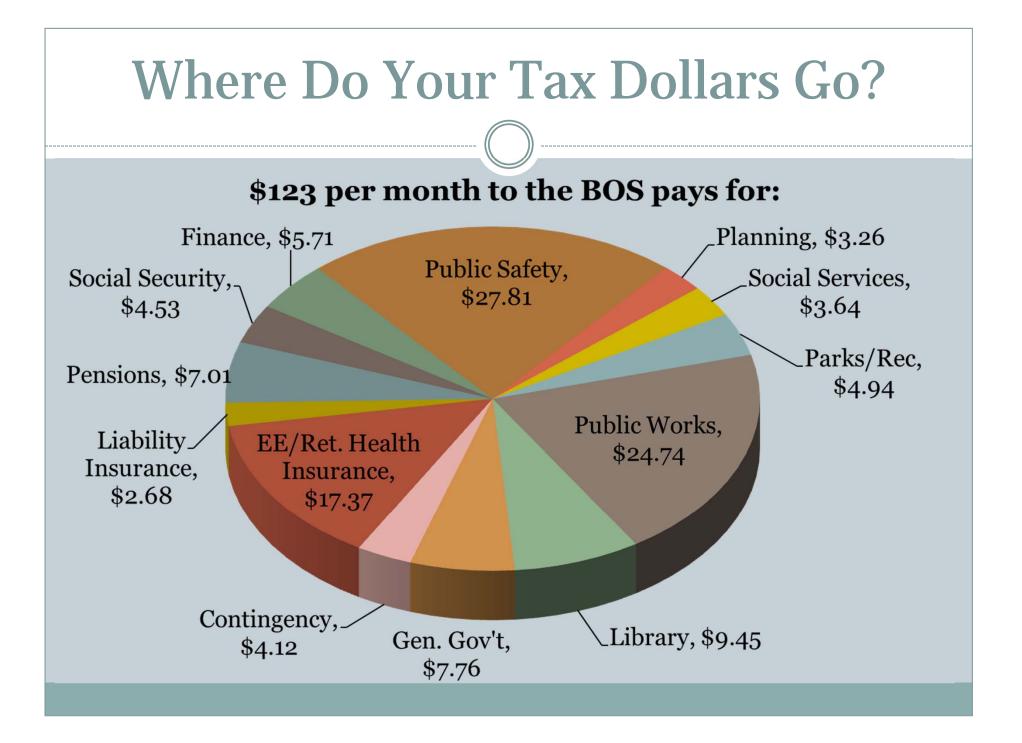

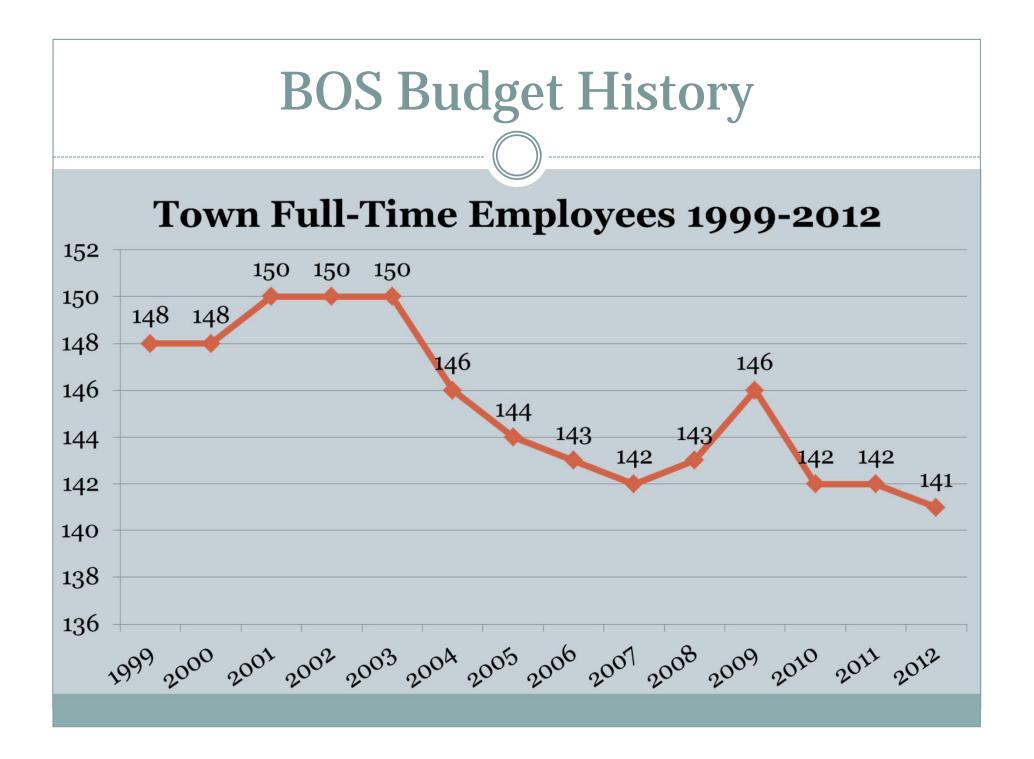

Board of Selectmen Budget

Board of Selectman Adopted Budget:

- ×\$18,347,575 (1.71% increase; \$308,975)
 - \$190,885 for pension interest assumption change recommended by the Board of Finance
 - Part-time Building Official
 - Farmington Valley Health District Increases
 - General Liability Insurance Increases
 - Wage Increases per Settled Union Contracts
