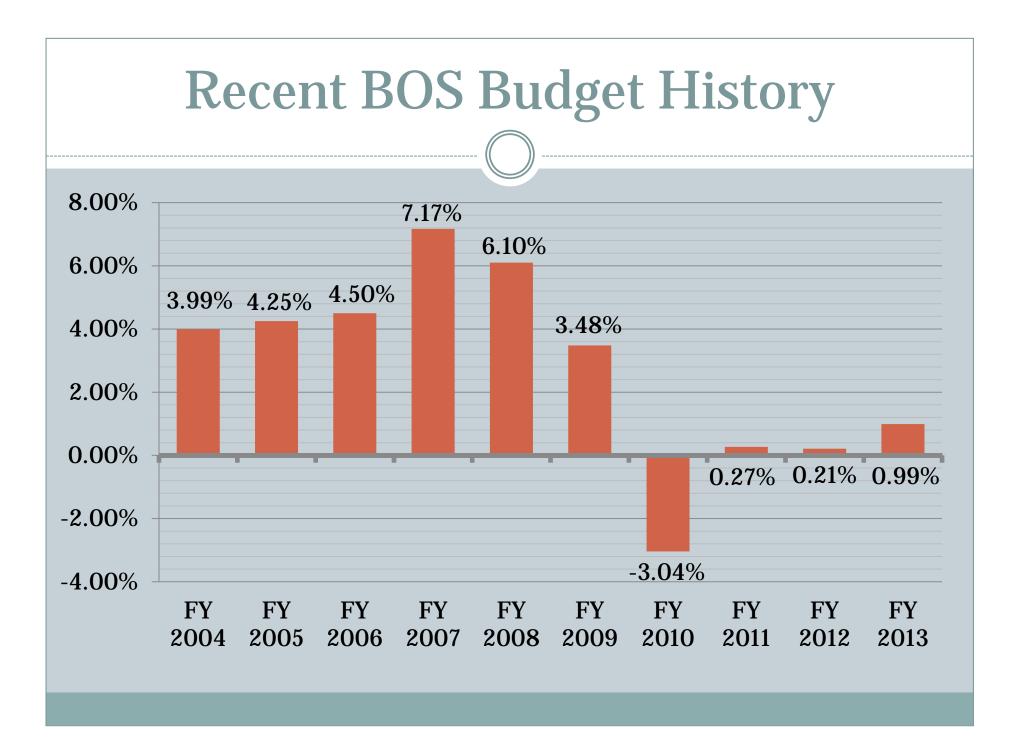

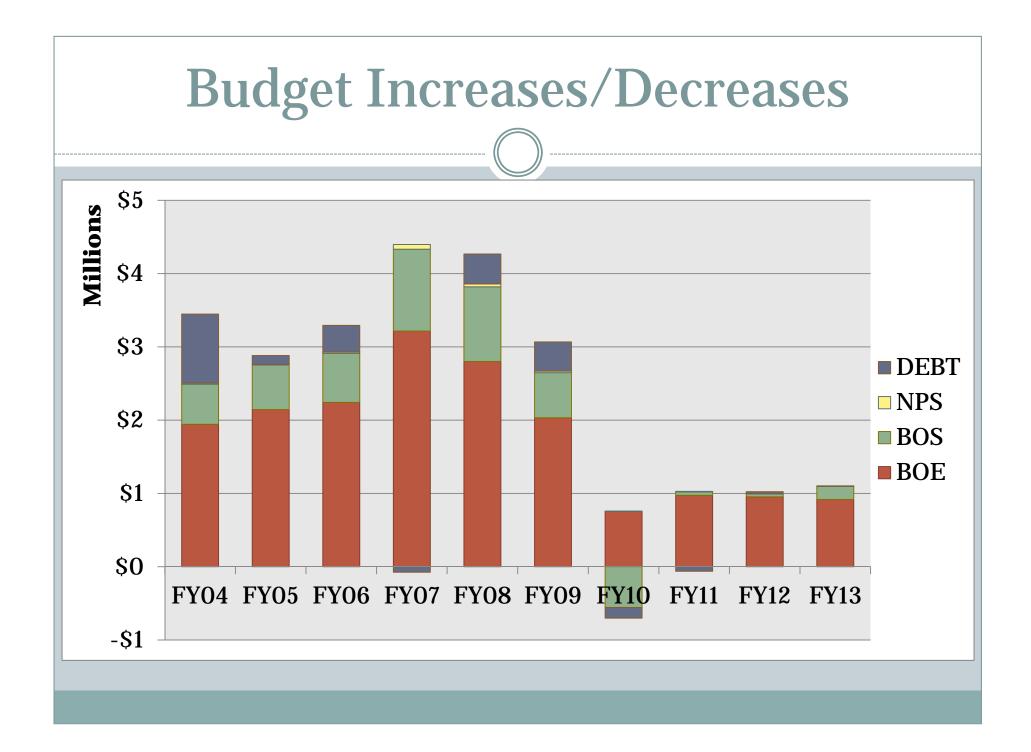


Pressures on Town Budget

Median Net Taxable Assessments

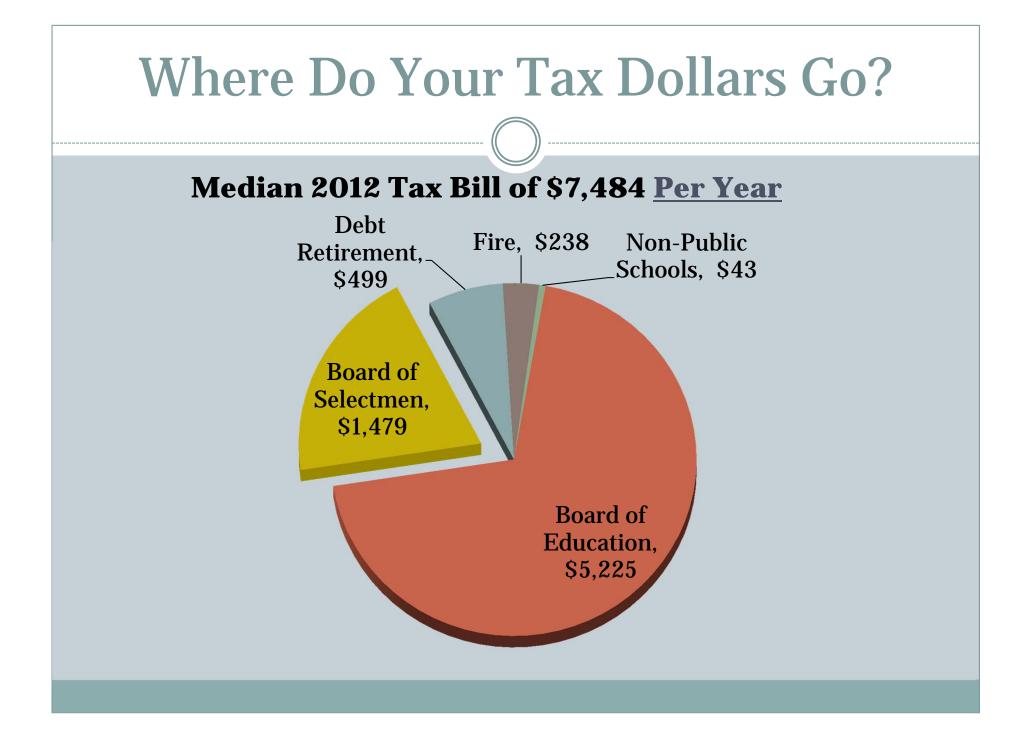
2002-2006 Grand Lists

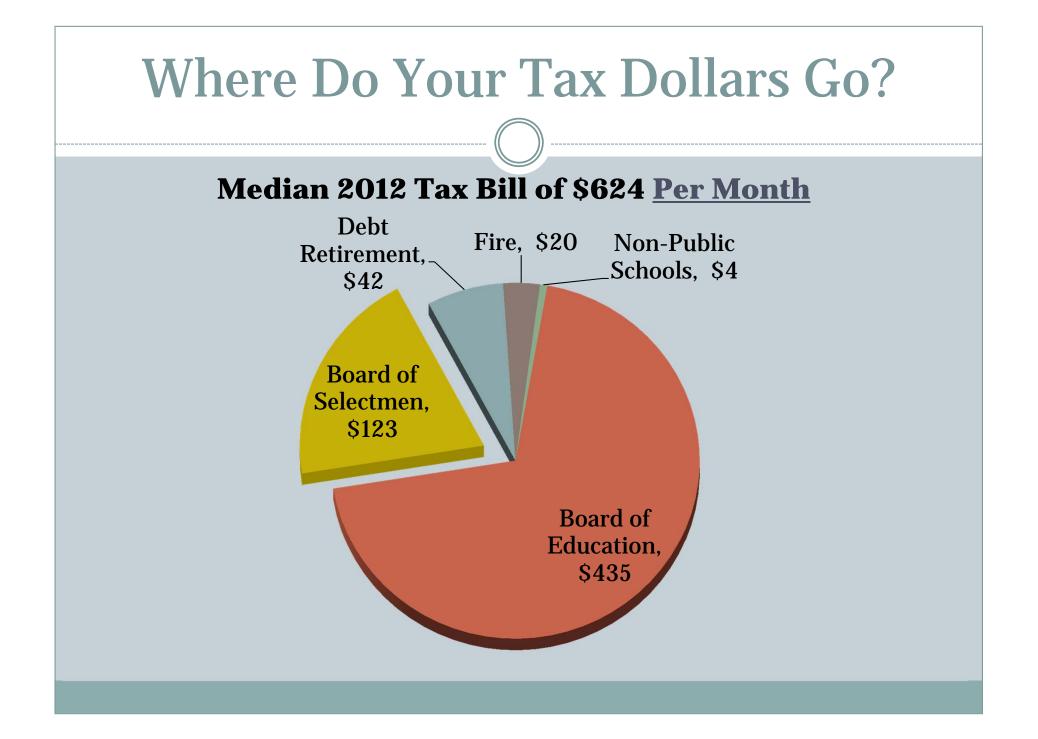
Median Net Taxable Assessment = $\frac{179,000}{1000}$ Based on an average home value of approx. 256,000

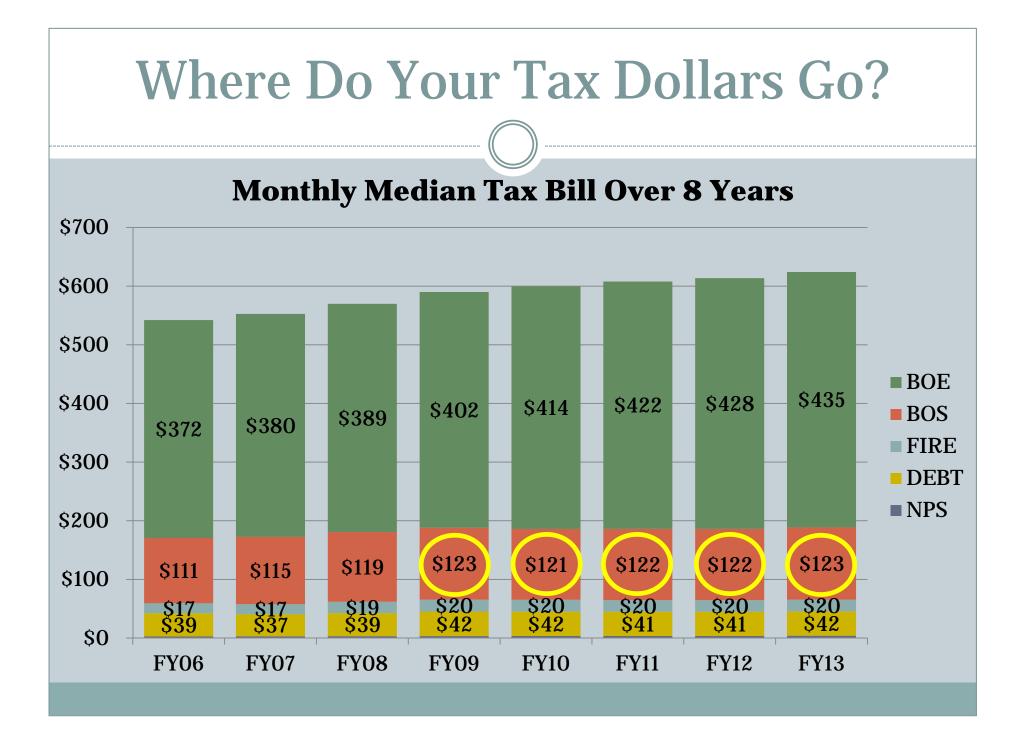
2007-2011 Grand Lists

Median Net Taxable Assessment of <u>\$231,000</u> Based on an average home value of approx. \$330,000

Using the current **32.40 Mill Rate**, the Median Tax Bill in Simsbury is approximately **\$7,484**

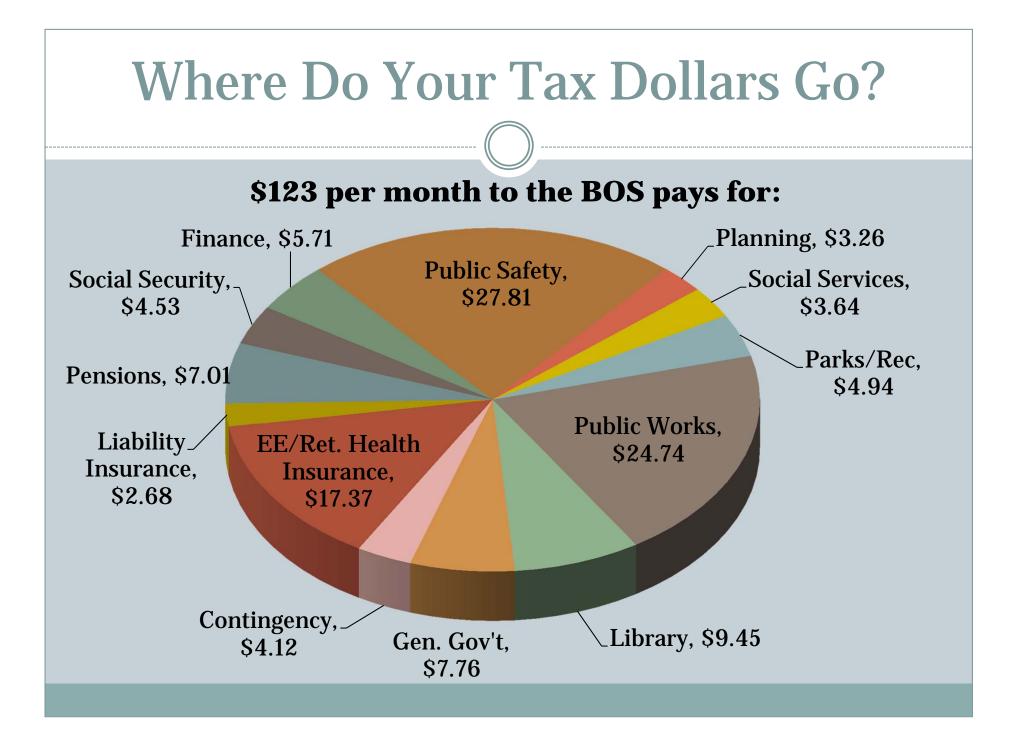

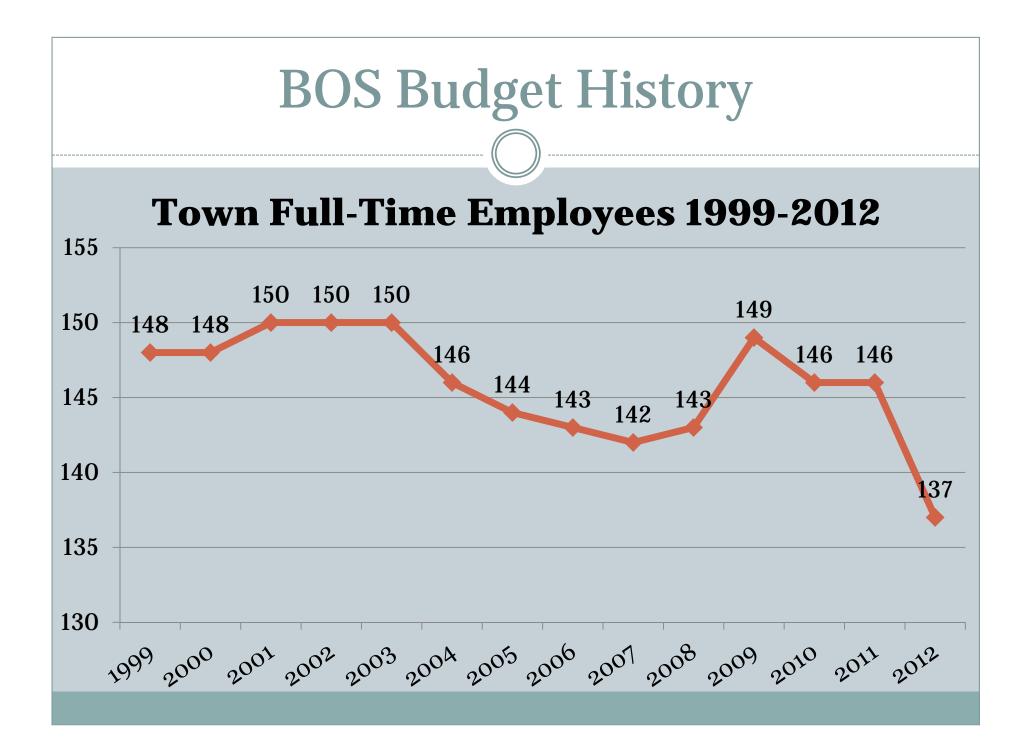
