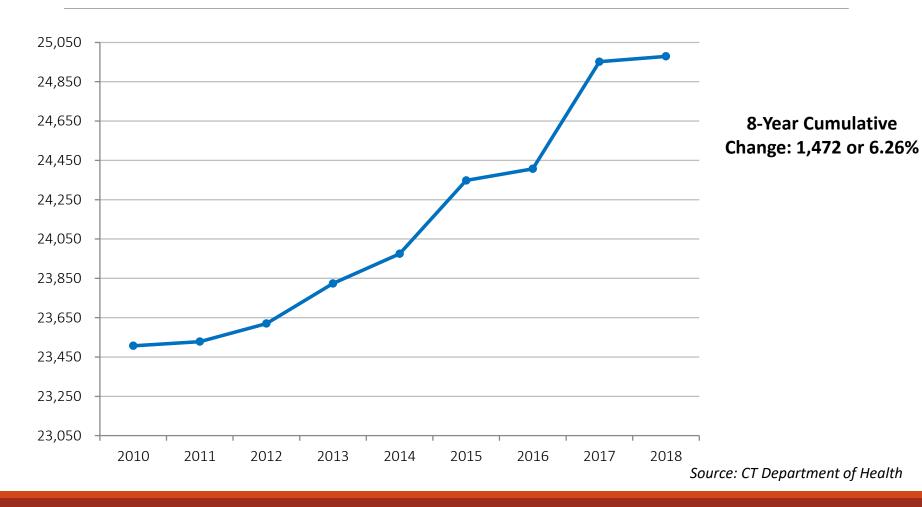

Development Trends

- Residential Development
 - Ridge at Talcott Mountain: 269 out of 301 units have been permitted; 208 certificates of occupancy issued to date
 - Highcroft Place: permits issued for all 48 townhouse units
 - Cambridge Crossing: 79 single family homes; 9 certificates of occupancy issued
- Commercial Projects
 - Big Y construction Anticipated opening of 10/1/2020
 - Mclean Independent Living Expansion
 - Ensign Bickford Aerospace and Defense
- Potential Development
 - 18 acres off Route 44 (north of Hoffman Auto) has been re-zoned for commercial development
 - Powder Forest: commercial parcel located at the northwestern corner of the intersection of Hopmeadow Street and Powder Forest Drive

Budget Overview

- \$23,705,961 Town operating budget
 - Does not include cash for capital, debt service, or operating transfers
- Increase of \$1,486,888 or 6.69%

FY20/21 Service Changes

- Assessor inspection services (\$25,000)
 - Projected to add \$1.724 million to grand list, which will result in approximately \$65,000 in revenue (\$40,000 net of proposed cost)
- Parks facility maintenance technician position (\$96,232, includes benefits)
- Police administration reorganization
 - Upgrade one sergeant position to lieutenant (\$4,260, includes benefits)
 - Deputy Chief position (\$183,872, includes benefits)
- Library materials (\$20,000)
 - Digital and print content for adult, teen, and business

Budget Drivers

- Contractual Salary Increases
 - Anticipated general wage increases (contingency) \$169,000
 - Step increases \$78,844
 - Minimum wage impact \$44,000 across all departments
- Debt Service
 - Increase of \$548,647 or 11.14%
- Pension/OPEB
 - Increase of \$712,079 or 47.07%
 - Reflects actuarial required contribution
 - Reflects updated mortality table
 - Reduces interest rate assumption from 6.75% to 6.625%

 - Radio system upgrade/replacement \$1,202,000
 - Open space acquisition \$2,200,000
 - Highway pavement management (partial) \$605,000
- General Fund
 - Public Works facility paving & storm drainage \$330,000
 - Sidewalk reconstruction \$200,000
 - Capital reserve contribution \$50,000
 - District Network Infrastructure, Board of Ed \$500,000

FY20/21 CNR Fund Projects

- Operating Transfers
 - Three police cruisers \$141,000
 - Truck replacement \$180,000
- Other Funds
 - Dial-A-Ride Van (partial) \$12,600 (DAR fund)
 - Two patrol supervisor cruisers \$110,000 (Private Duty Fund)
 - Mobile Data Terminals \$55,000 (Private Duty Fund)
 - Eno clock tower repairs \$21,000 (Eno Trust)
 - Greens mower replacement \$45,000 (Golf Equipment Fund)
 - Sewer Improvements \$100,000 (Sewer Use Fund)
 - Woodland St/Hopmeadow St Sewer Upgrade \$50,000 (Sewer Use Fund)

Next Steps

- Public Hearing April 7
 - Notice of hearing must be published no later than March 31
 - First public hearing must be held no later than April 10
- Possible hearing continuation April 21
 - Board of Finance must approve budget no more than 10 days after final public hearing
- Budget Referendum May 19 (anticipated)
 - Notice of referendum must be published no later than May 12
