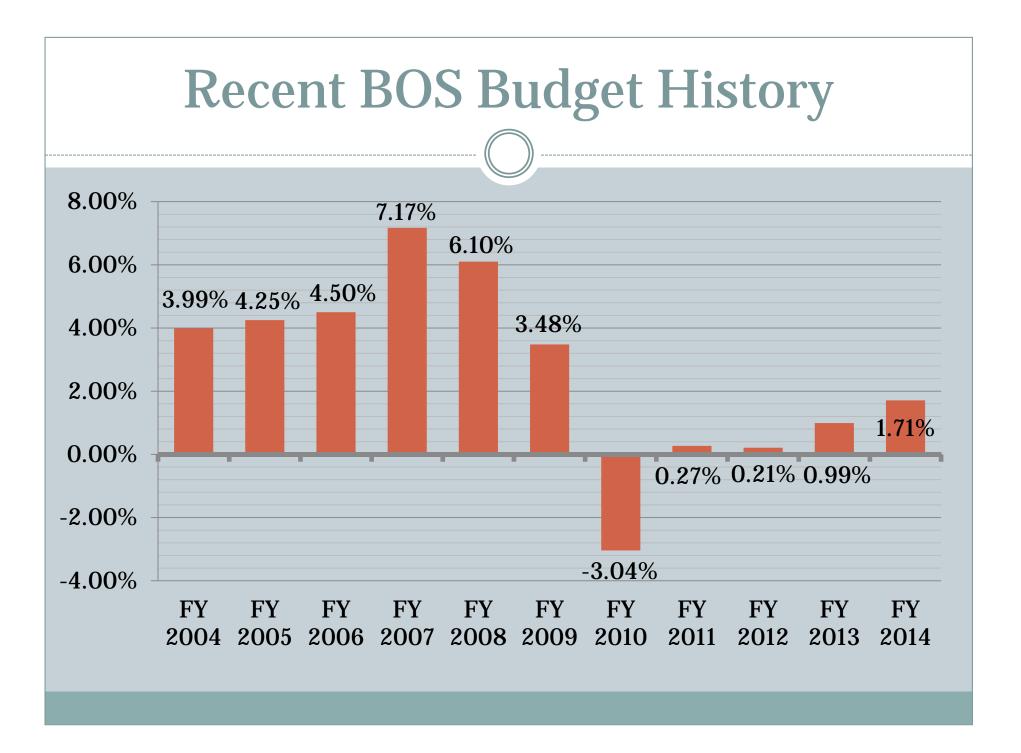

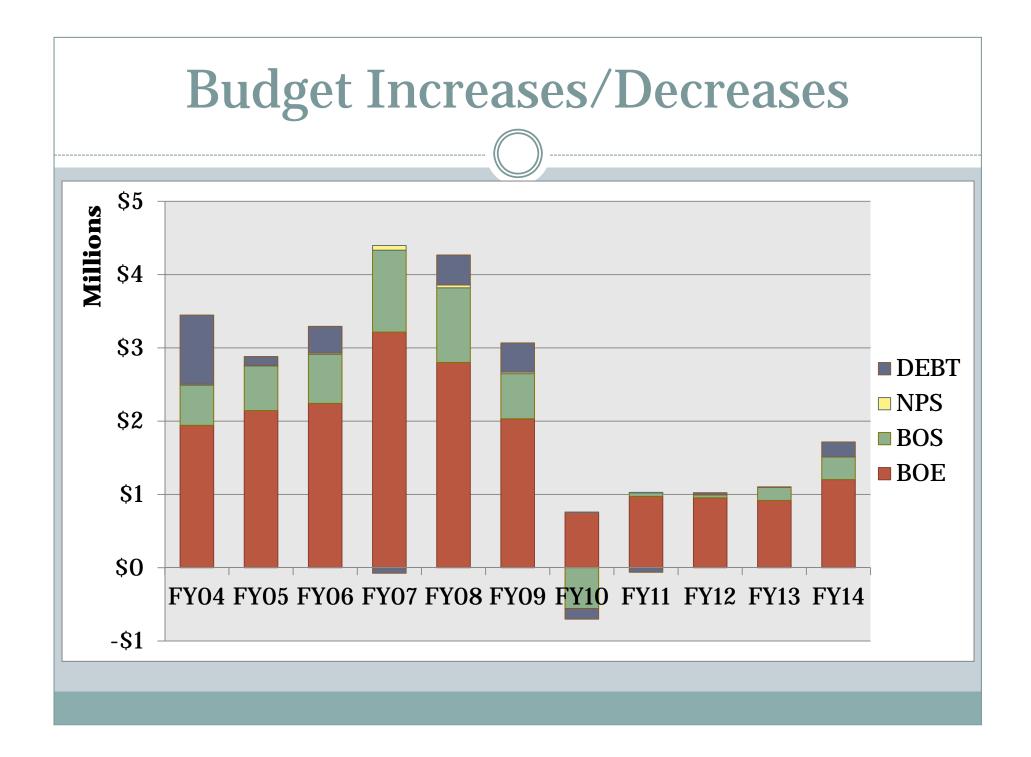


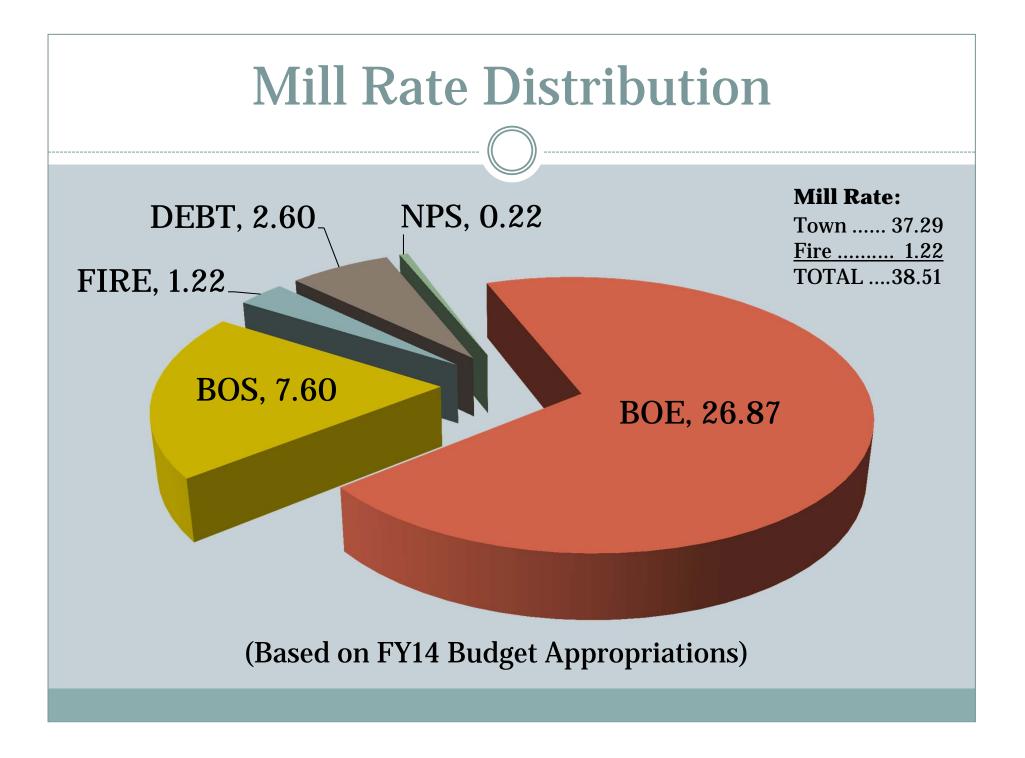

Median Net Taxable Assessment of **\$231,000**

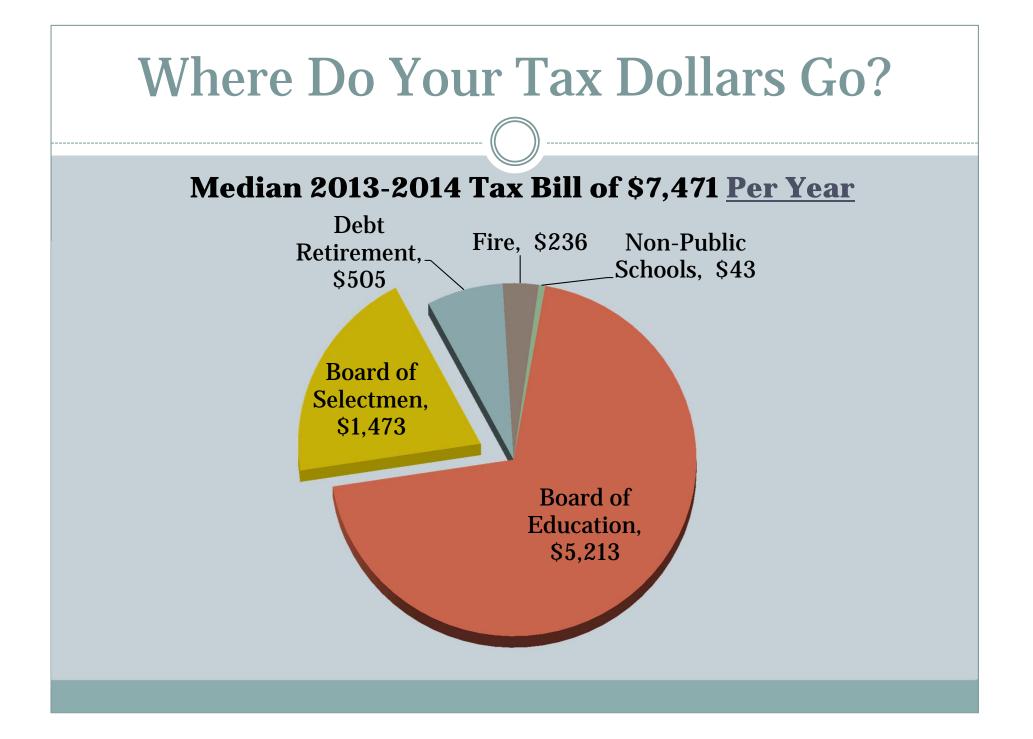
Based on an average home value of approx. \$330,000

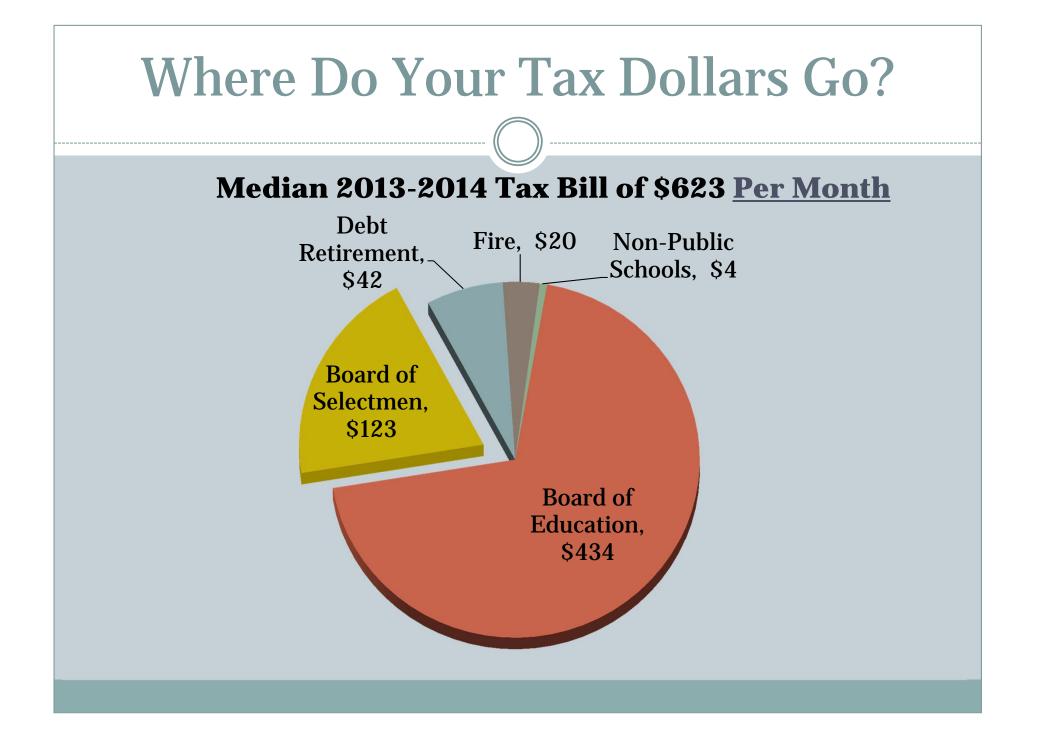
Using the previous **32.40 Mill Rate**, the Median Tax Bill in Simsbury was approximately **\$7,484**.

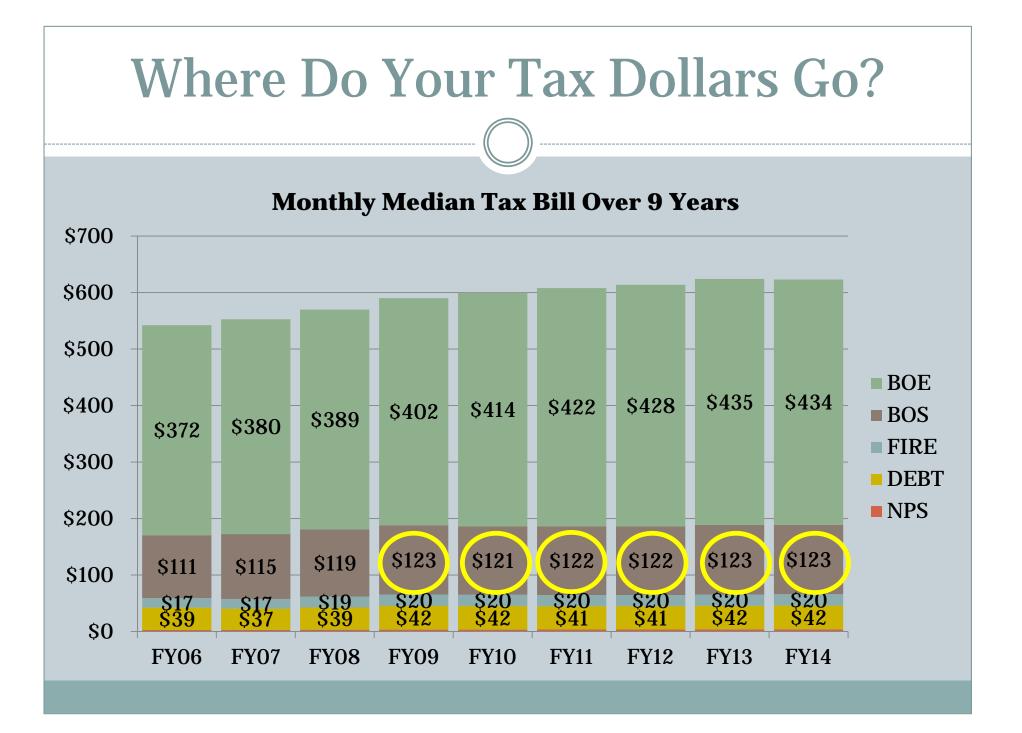
2012-2016 Grand Lists

Median Net Taxable Assessment of **<u>\$194,000</u>** Based on an average home value of approx. \$277,000

Using the current **38.51 Mill Rate**, the Median Tax Bill in Simsbury is approximately **\$7,471**

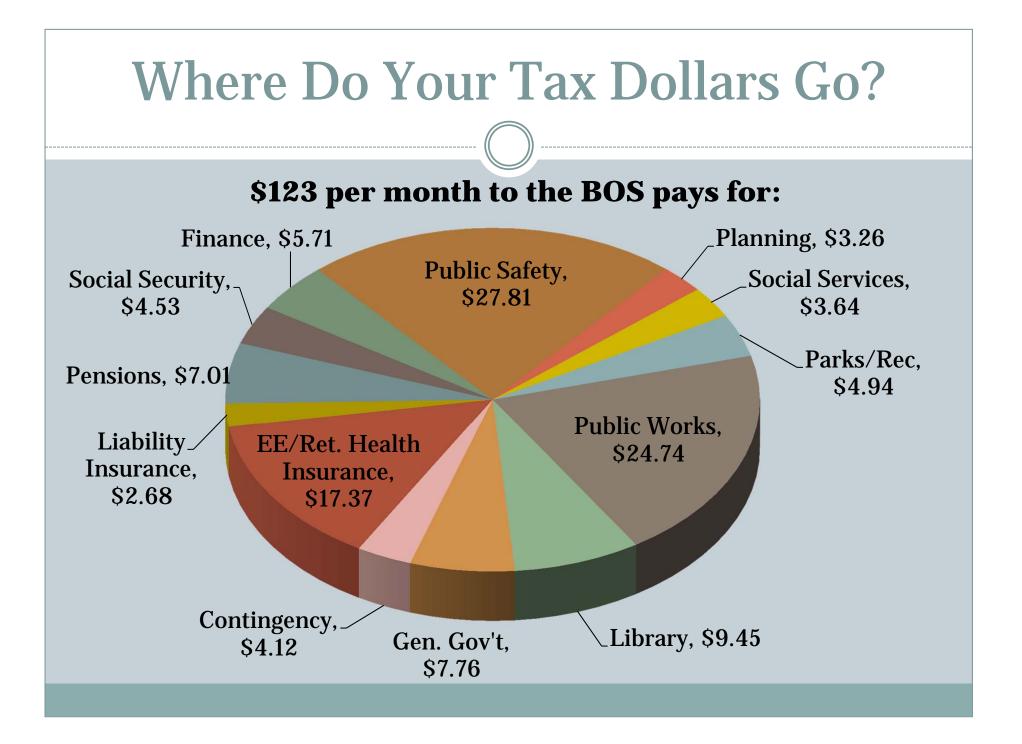
