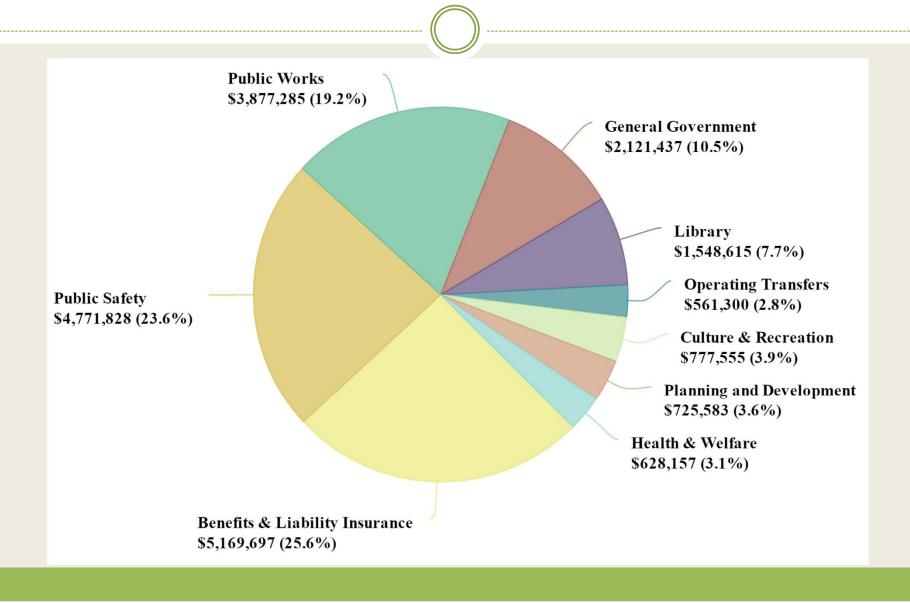
This budget responsibly preserves Simsbury as the beautiful place we call home in the most cost efficient manner.

The FY 17-18 recommended budget is

- **\$ 20,181,457**
- **x**Increase of \$ 691,014
- ×3.55% over last year's Town Budget
- ×0.73% over total Town/BOE Budget
- ×\$4.34 per month for median taxpayer

Major Town Accomplishments

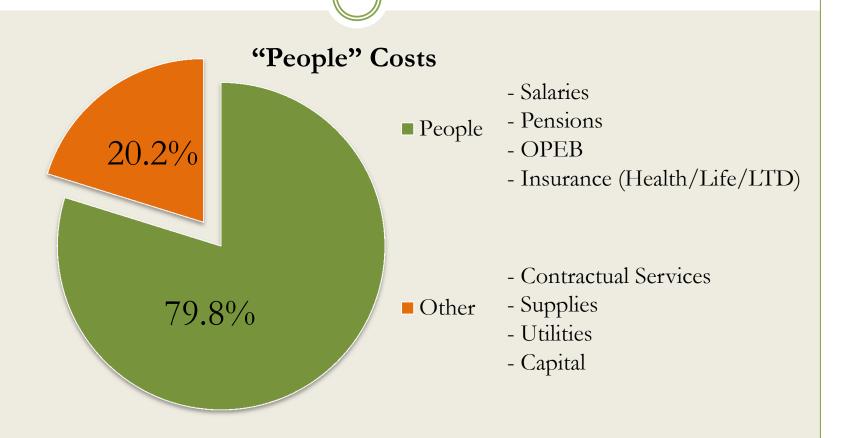

Cost Drivers of the Budget



If the budget was increased <u>only</u> by negotiated salaries and benefits the total budget would have to increase by 3.50%.

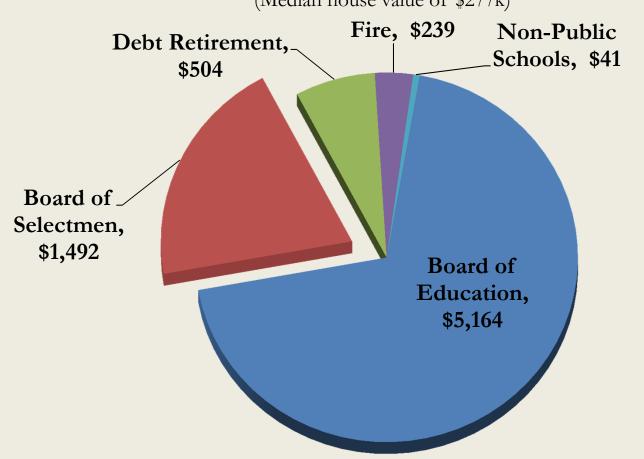

Where Do Your Tax Dollars Go?

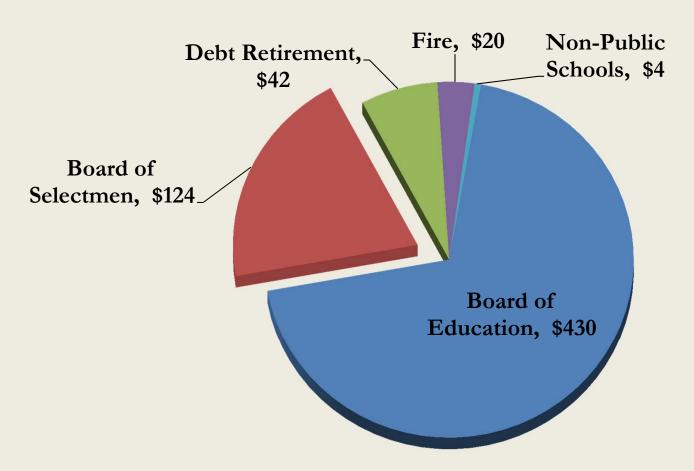


(Median house value of \$277k)

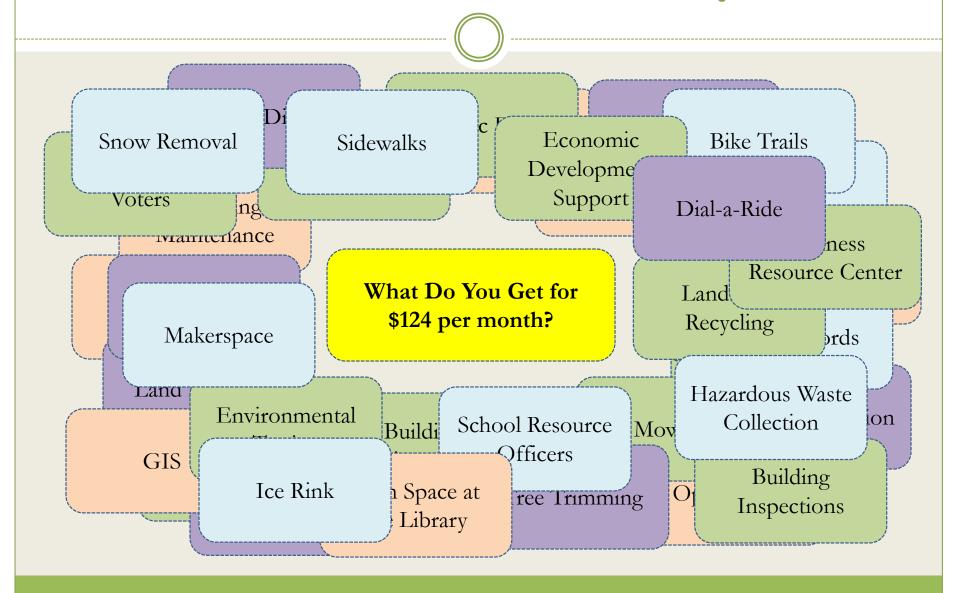


Where Do Your Tax Dollars Go?



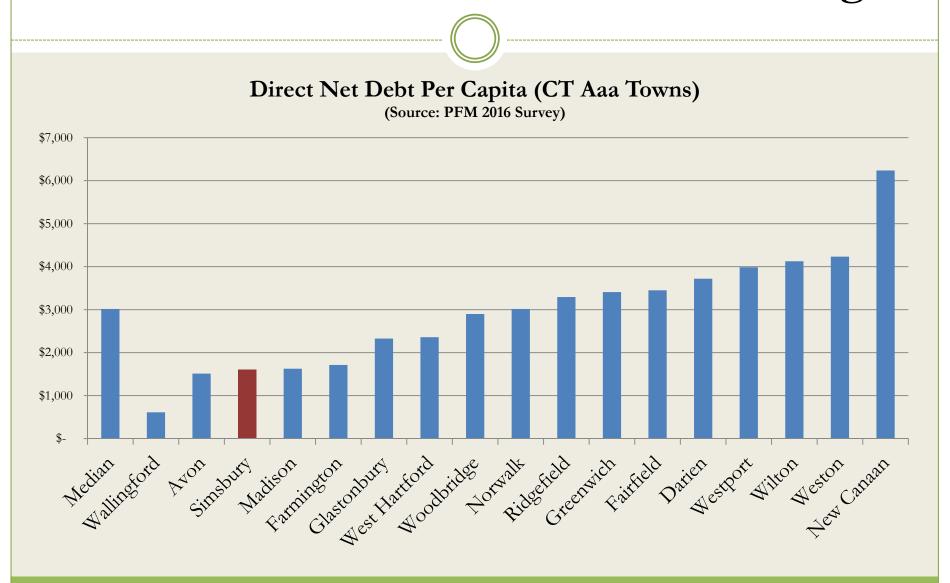


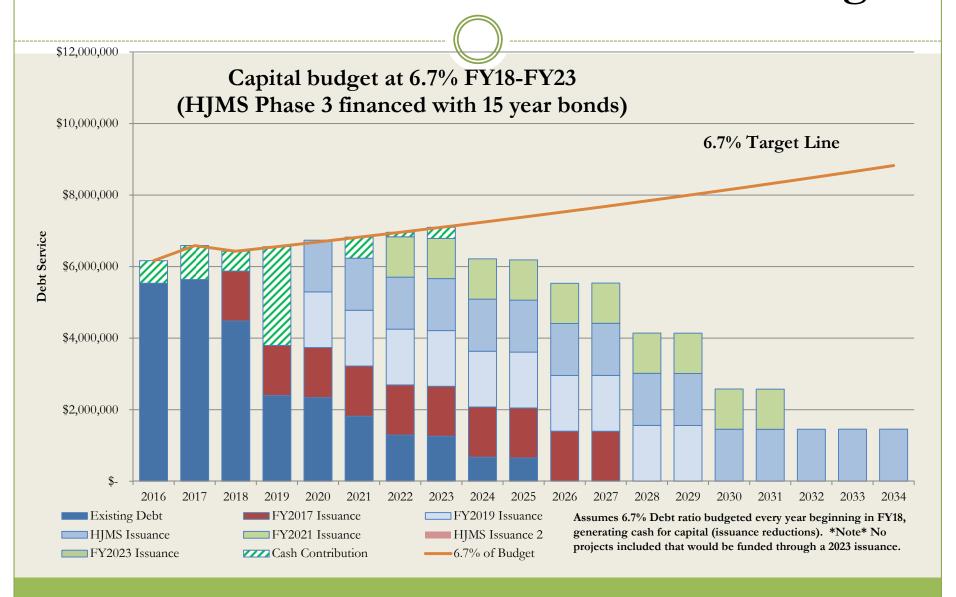
What Do Your Tax Dollars Pay For?
