## 5. Old Business and Working Team Updates:

Team A Events Updates: a.) Dominique asked for volunteers for the April 28 Volunteer Expo which we are co-sponsoring. Pat, Joe, Dominique and Joyce (if she is in town) said they'd be there. b.) Diane Phillips volunteered to help with flower planting for the Ann Marie Potter Bike Sculpture Memorial Flower Basket as our May Bike Month event. We have not yet heard back from Vicente Garcia and do not have a date yet c.) Update on the State Open House Day on June 9. So far the only group that has signed up is the Bridge of Flowers. Committee said they wanted to Open Visitors Center as we did last year, plus we reviewed last year's groups and agreed to contact them to let them know. Dominique said she got enthusiastic support for the camping idea from some bike people and said perhaps its time to set a meeting with all interested parities to get the idea off the ground.
