**1**. Joe called the meeting to order at Metro Bis at 7:11; Septembers minutes were adopted unanimously

Joe updated Communications and the tremendous PR outreach by Alliances by Alisa on all the events which have been going on in town including the 10/12 MLK Memorial groundbreaking at Simsbury Free Library. 3. Old Business & Working Team Updates:

**Team A Events**: There was more discussion on the 'Trail10K name. Rick is flexible. We brainstormed some ideas and Joe suggested we all think more about them and send ideas to him. Sheree reported the trail has sparked a lot of enthusiasm in Tariffville. Joe mentioned a number of possible locations for the heritage trail. Parks and Rec will be discussing location on their property at an Oct. 25 meeting. Joe assured the committee that in the proposed Trail 10K plan there is an Advisory Group representing Native Americans to review the proposed structures that would include Native American people. The SHS Scarecrow & Heritage Day were tremendous successes, Storyteller's Cottage celebrated its 1 year anniversary with an Open House and is doing very well with 7 part-time employees.

**Team B: Outreach**: Visitors Center; Charmaine updated us on her research into the costs of a hand-drawn Tourist map. A franchise could be purchased for an up-front cost of \$25,000; a one-sided map for \$4,000; doubled sided for \$7,500 plus 40cents per copy. We could ask the town for the upfront costs and then sell ads.

**Team C: Recognition:** Potential opportunities for 2018/19 - no discussion **Team D: Governmental**: Updates on new bike rack progress, Town is considering our Kiosk Location recommendation at ENO and getting quote on cost, Dominique reported on the new EDC members; Now that they're in place BOS will consider our Tourism recommendations: Vision 2020.
